REFERRED TO PUBLIC HEALTH AND WELFARE, JUNE 7, 1990

A RESOLUTION

Urging the Department of Public Welfare to reconsider the 1 2 methodology adopted under the State's Medical Assistance Plan to more reasonably and adequately reimburse all hospitals of 3 4 the Commonwealth in general, and rural hospitals in 5 particular, to provide adequate service and reasonable access 6 to low-income individuals as required by Federal law. 7 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Welfare has adopted a 8 Medical Assistance Plan and methodology for reimbursing hospitals for providing services to medical assistance 9 10 recipients; and 11 WHEREAS, The plan is required by Federal law to provide payments that are reasonable and adequate to meet the costs 12 13 which must be incurred by efficiently and economically operated hospitals in order to provide care and services in conformity 14 15 with applicable Federal and State laws and regulations and 16 quality and safety standards; and 17 WHEREAS, The plan is required to assure that individuals eligible for medical assistance have reasonable access to 18

19 inpatient hospital services of adequate quality; and

WHEREAS, The plan is required to take into account the
situations of hospitals which serve a disproportionate number of
low-income patients; and

WHEREAS, The plan is required to be based upon findings and certification that the reimbursement rates are reasonable and adequate to meet the necessary costs of efficiently and conomically operated hospitals; and

8 WHEREAS, The plan is required to be based upon a finding and 9 certification that the reimbursement rates assure medical 10 assistance patients reasonable access to inpatient hospital 11 care; and

12 WHEREAS, The methodology used by the Department of Public 13 Welfare to determine the reimbursement to hospitals has resulted 14 in unreasonable and inadequate funding to hospitals in general 15 and rural hospitals in particular; and

16 WHEREAS, The application of certain variables to rank 17 particular hospitals into and within particular groupings has 18 resulted in unreasonable and inadequate funding; and 19 WHEREAS, The application of the chosen "budget neutrality 20 factor" further reduces already inadequate and unreasonable 21 funding; and

WHEREAS, The methodology adopted by the Department of Public Welfare does not provide reasonable and adequate reimbursement of costs to efficiently and economically operated hospitals; and WHEREAS, The failure to provide reasonable and adequate reimbursement is depriving individuals eligible for medical assistance of reasonable access to inpatient hospital services of adequate quality; and

29 WHEREAS, The methodology does not take into account the 30 situations of hospitals in general, and rural hospitals in 19900S0169R2264 - 2 - particular, which serve a disproportionate number of low-income
patients; and

3 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Welfare has not based its 4 plan on findings and certifications as required by Federal law; 5 therefore be it

6 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge the Department of Public Welfare to reconsider the plan and methodology adopted to 7 reimburse all hospitals of this Commonwealth in general, and 8 rural hospitals in particular, in a reasonable and adequate 9 fashion as required by Federal law; and be it further 10 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate of Pennsylvania urge the Department of Public Welfare to base its plan on actual findings; and be it 12 13 further

14 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge the Department of Public 15 Welfare to present its plan to the Senate and the House of 16 Representatives no later than September 1, 1990.
