A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating September 11, 2008, as "Pennsylvania's Day of
- 2 Remembrance of the events of September 11, 2001.
- 3 WHEREAS, There can be no greater tragedy than the intentional
- 4 taking of innocent lives; and
- 5 WHEREAS, On September 11, 2001, Al Qaeda terrorists hijacked
- 6 and intentionally flew two planes into the twin towers of the
- 7 World Trade Center in Manhattan, New York City, and hijacked and
- 8 crashed a third aircraft into the United States Department of
- 9 Defense headquarters at the Pentagon in Arlington County,
- 10 Virginia; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The first battle of the War on Terrorism took place
- 12 in the skies over Somerset County, Pennsylvania, and was
- 13 ultimately won by the heroism of the passengers aboard United
- 14 Airlines Flight 93 who courageously fought to regain control of
- 15 the plane and prevented additional death and destruction; and
- 16 WHEREAS, These attacks claimed nearly 3,000 innocent lives,
- 17 becoming the most devastating attack on American soil in our

- 1 229-year history; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Many individuals unselfishly gave their lives in
- 3 unyielding courage and sacrifice with the passenger resistance
- 4 that occurred on United Airlines Flight 93 in Somerset County,
- 5 Pennsylvania; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Their acts of courage and sacrifice for our country
- 7 are worthy of acknowledgment and commendation, and they shall
- 8 remain in our hearts and minds forever, their remembrance
- 9 continuing to be passed on to future generations; and
- 10 WHEREAS, September 11, 2008, marks the 7th anniversary of the
- 11 attacks, which should never be forgotten; therefore be it
- 12 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate September 11 as
- 13 "Pennsylvania's Day of Remembrance" in honor of those persons
- 14 who lost their lives in the September 11, 2001, attacks, those
- 15 individuals directly affected by the tragedy of the attacks and
- 16 those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country fighting
- 17 the war on terrorism; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage all schools, public
- 19 offices and businesses to pause in a moment of silence to
- 20 reflect upon the tragedy and the sacrifices made on September
- 21 11, 2001, and to further remember the families of those persons
- 22 who perished and all of our fellow citizens affected by this
- 23 event.
