AN ACT

Amending the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to dogs, regulating 2 the keeping of dogs; providing for the licensing of dogs and 3 kennels; providing for the protection of dogs and the 4 detention and destruction of dogs in certain cases; 5 regulating the sale and transportation of dogs; declaring 6 dogs to be personal property and the subject of theft; providing for the abandonment of animals; providing for the assessment of damages done to animals; providing for payment 7 8 9 10 of damages by the Commonwealth in certain cases and the liability of the owner or keeper of dogs for such damages; 11 imposing powers and duties on certain State and local 12 officers and employees; providing penalties; and creating a 13 Dog Law Restricted Account," in sterilization of dogs and 14 cats, further providing for spaying or neutering as condition 15 for release of certain animals and repealing certain 16 provisions relating to sterilization of dogs and cats. 17 18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 19 hereby enacts as follows: 20 Section 1. Section 902-A of the act of December 7, 1982 21 (P.L.784, No.225), known as the Dog Law, is amended to read: 22 Section 902-A. Spaying or neutering as condition for release of 23 certain animals. 24 No dog or cat may be adopted by a new owner from a releasing 25 agency unless the animal has been sterilized by a licensed

- 1 doctor of veterinary medicine [or unless the new owner signs an
- 2 agreement to have the animal sterilized by or under the
- 3 supervision of a licensed doctor of veterinary medicine and
- 4 deposits funds with the releasing agency to ensure that the
- 5 adopted animal will be sterilized. The amount of the deposit
- 6 required shall be determined by each releasing agency. In no
- 7 event shall the required deposit be less than \$30 for a dog or
- 8 \$20 for a cat] of the releasing agency.
- 9 Section 2. Sections 903-A, 904-A, 905-A, 906-A, 907-A, 908-
- 10 A, 909-A, 910-A and 911-A of the act are repealed:
- 11 [Section 903-A. Refund of deposit upon proof of sterilization.
- 12 The funds deposited with the releasing agency shall be
- 13 refunded to the new owner upon the presentation of a written
- 14 statement signed by a licensed doctor of veterinary medicine
- 15 that the subject animal has been sterilized. However, no refunds
- 16 shall be made unless the animal was sterilized within 60 days of
- 17 acquisition in the case of a mature animal or, in the case of an
- 18 immature animal, within 30 days of the date the animal attained
- 19 the age of six months.
- 20 Section 904-A. Rules and sterilization agreement.
- 21 Releasing agencies may establish any additional rules to
- 22 implement this article, provided that such rules are not in
- 23 conflict with the provisions or purpose of this article to
- 24 require the sterilization of all dogs and cats adopted from
- 25 releasing agencies. The sterilization agreement to be used by
- 26 releasing agencies shall be in substantially the following form:
- 27 STERILIZATION AGREEMENT

- 4 In consideration of the adoption of this animal and in
- 5 further consideration of mutual obligations herein, the
- 6 releasing agency authorizes the adoption of the following animal
- 7 to the new owner:

- 9 1. The releasing agency agrees to release the above-listed
- 10 animal into the care of the new owner and refund the new owner's
- 11 sterilization deposit provided that:
- 12 (1) The animal is sterilized by a licensed doctor of
- 13 veterinary medicine by (give date).
- 14 (2) A written statement signed by the licensed doctor of
- 15 veterinary medicine performing the sterilization that the animal
- 16 has been sterilized by the stated date is given to the releasing
- 17 agency.
- 18 2. The new owner accepts the above-listed animal and agrees:
- 19 (1) To have the animal sterilized by a licensed doctor of
- 20 veterinary medicine by (give date).
- 21 (2) To provide written evidence to the releasing agency from
- 22 the licensed doctor of veterinary medicine performing the
- 23 sterilization that the animal has been sterilized by the above
- 24 date listed. This agreement shall be binding upon the assigns,
- 25 heirs, executors and administrators of the respective parties.

14	Section 905-A. Extension of time to sterilize.
15	Upon presentation of a written report from a licensed doctor
16	of veterinary medicine stating that the life or health of an
17	adopted animal may be jeopardized by sterilization, the
18	releasing agency shall grant a 30-day extension of the period
19	within which sterilization would otherwise be required. Further
20	extensions shall be granted upon additional veterinary reports
21	stating their necessity.
22	Section 906-A. Exemption from sterilization; refund of
23	deposited funds.
24	Upon presentation of a written report from a licensed doctor
25	of veterinary medicine stating that the adopted animal has
26	already been sterilized or can never be sterilized due to old
27	age or a health condition that would likely result in the death
28	of the animal, the sterilization deposit shall be refunded.
29	Section 907-A. Death of adopted animal.
30	Upon request, the releasing agency shall refund deposited

- 1 funds to the new owner upon reasonable proof being presented to
- 2 the releasing agency by the new owner that the adopted animal
- 3 died before the expiration of the period during which the
- 4 sterilization was required to be completed.
- 5 Section 908-A. Forfeiture of deposited funds and adopted dog or
- 6 cat.
- 7 Failure of a new owner to comply with provisions of this
- 8 article shall result in the forfeiture of the deposited funds to
- 9 the releasing agency. The releasing agency may reclaim the dog
- 10 or cat from the new owner.
- 11 Section 909-A. Disposition of forfeited funds; record of
- 12 accounts.
- Funds which have been forfeited by new owners shall be placed
- 14 in an interest-bearing account belonging to the releasing
- 15 agency. The releasing agency may allocate the unused funds from
- 16 such account to programs which directly promote, subsidize or
- 17 otherwise reduce the cost of sterilization of animals of the
- 18 releasing agency. Funds may also be used to provide for the
- 19 health and welfare of animals being cared for by the releasing
- 20 agency. The releasing agency shall maintain an accurate
- 21 accounting of these forfeited funds.
- 22 Section 910-A. Construction of article.
- 23 The provisions of this article shall not be construed to
- 24 require the sterilization of dogs and cats which are being held
- 25 in releasing agencies which might be claimed by their rightful
- 26 owners. Further, this article shall not be construed to
- 27 interfere with municipal ordinances or the policies and programs
- 28 of releasing agencies that meet or exceed the sterilization
- 29 requirements set forth in this article.
- 30 Section 911-A. Penalty.

- 1 Failure to comply with the provisions of this article
- 2 relating to the sterilization of animals constitutes a summary
- 3 offense.]
- 4 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
