- 4 SECTION 9. PROHIBITION OF INTEREST BY PUBLIC OFFICERS,
- 5 PUBLIC EMPLOYES AND PARTY OFFICERS IN PARI-MUTUEL RACING
- 6 ACTIVITIES.--(A) NO PUBLIC OFFICER, PUBLIC EMPLOYE OR PARTY
- 7 OFFICER SHALL:
- 8 (1) HOLD ANY LICENSE TO CONDUCT A PARI-MUTUEL MEET FROM THE
- 9 STATE HORSE RACING COMMISSION; OR
- 10 (2) OWN OR HOLD, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, ANY PROPRIETARY
- 11 INTEREST, STOCK OR OBLIGATION OF ANY FIRM, ASSOCIATION OR
- 12 CORPORATION (I) WHICH IS LICENSED BY SUCH COMMISSION TO CONDUCT
- 13 PARI-MUTUEL RACING, OR (II) WHICH IS LICENSED TO CONDUCT ITS
- 14 OCCUPATION, TRADE OR BUSINESS AT RACE TRACKS AT WHICH PARI-
- 15 MUTUEL RACE MEETS ARE CONDUCTED, OR (III) WHICH OWNS OR LEASES
- 16 TO ANY LICENSED ASSOCIATION OR CORPORATION A RACE TRACK AT WHICH
- 17 PARI-MUTUEL RACING IS CONDUCTED, OR (IV) WHICH PARTICIPATES IN
- 18 THE MANAGEMENT OF ANY LICENSEE CONDUCTING PARI-MUTUEL RACING; OR
- 19 (3) HOLD ANY OFFICE OR EMPLOYMENT WITH ANY FIRM, ASSOCIATION
- 20 OR CORPORATION SPECIFIED IN CLAUSE (2) OF THIS SECTION; OR
- 21 (4) SELL (OR BE A MEMBER OF A FIRM OR OWN TEN PERCENT OR
- 22 MORE OF THE STOCK OF ANY CORPORATION WHICH SELLS) ANY GOODS OR
- 23 SERVICES TO ANY FIRM, ASSOCIATION OR CORPORATION SPECIFIED IN
- 24 CLAUSE (2) OF THIS SECTION.
- THE PROVISIONS OF CLAUSE (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION (A) SHALL NOT
- 26 APPLY TO A PUBLIC EMPLOYE [OF A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION] (OTHER
- 27 THAN A POLICE OFFICER OR PAID EMPLOYE OF A POLICE DEPARTMENT,
- 28 SHERIFF'S OFFICE, DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE OR OTHER LAW
- 29 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY) [WHOSE COMPENSATION IS LESS THAN TWELVE

- 18 Section 12.1. Security Personnel; Powers and Duties;
- 19 Penalty. -- The State Horse Racing Commission and any association
- 20 licensed by the commission is hereby authorized and empowered to
- 21 employ persons as security personnel. These persons shall
- 22 possess the powers and duties of a peace officer with respect to
- 23 the enforcement of the criminal laws of the Commonwealth within
- 24 the race meeting grounds or enclosure. Such designated persons
- 25 are also authorized and empowered to interrogate and eject from
- 26 the race meeting grounds or enclosure any persons suspected of
- 27 violating any rule or regulation promulgated by the State Horse
- 28 Racing Commission. The State Horse Racing Commission fand any
- 29 association licensed by the commission and refuse admission to
- 30 and eject from enclosure of the race track operated by any

- 6 the State Horse Racing Commission for any association in
- 7 refusing any person admission to or ejecting him from a race
- 8 meeting ground or enclosure shall not be because of the race,
- 9 creed, color, sex, national origin or religion of such person
- 10 and shall be reviewable by the Court of Common Pleas of Dauphin
- 11 County as provided in the act of June 4, 1945 (P.L.1388,
- 12 No.442), known as the "Administrative Agency Law." Any
- 13 <u>association licensed by the commission may refuse admission to</u>
- 14 and eject from the enclosure of the race track operated by any
- 15 <u>association any person except that no person shall be refused</u>
- 16 admission or be ejected because of the race, color, creed, sex,
- 17 <u>national origin or religion of such person.</u> A licensee may not
- 18 refuse admission to or eject a law enforcement official while
- 19 such official is actually engaged in the performance of his
- 20 official duties. A person found within a race track enclosure
- 21 after having been refused admission thereto or ejected therefrom
- 22 shall, upon conviction thereof in a summary proceeding, be
- 23 sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200)
- 24 or undergo imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days, or
- 25 both.
- Section 2. 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
