29 REDEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE AND REDEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE CAPITAL
30 PROJECTS, FLOOD CONTROL PROJECTS, KEYSTONE RECREATION, PARK
31 AND CONSERVATION PROJECTS AND FORESTRY BRIDGE PROJECTS TO BE
32 CONSTRUCTED OR ACQUIRED OR ASSISTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF

4 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, THE PENNSYLVANIA FISH AND BOAT
5 COMMISSION OR THE PENNSYLVANIA GAME COMMISSION, TOGETHER WITH
6 THEIR ESTIMATED FINANCIAL COSTS; AUTHORIZING THE INCURRING OF
7 DEBT WITHOUT THE APPROVAL OF THE ELECTORS FOR THE PURPOSE OF
8 FINANCING THE PROJECTS TO BE CONSTRUCTED OR ACQUIRED OR
9 ASSISTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES, THE
10 DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES, THE
11 DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, THE DEPARTMENT OF
12 COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OR THE DEPARTMENT OF
13 TRANSPORTATION; STATING THE ESTIMATED USEFUL LIFE OF THE
14 PROJECTS; AUTHORIZING CERTAIN WAIVERS; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS;
15 AND MAKING REPEALS.

16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
17 hereby enacts as follows:

21 ~~Section 2. Total authorizations.~~

22 ~~(a) Public improvements. The total authorization for the~~
23 ~~additional capital projects in the category of public~~
24 ~~improvement projects itemized in section 3 and to be acquired or~~
25 ~~constructed by the Department of General Services, its~~
26 ~~successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of~~
27 ~~debt, shall be \$1,359,712,000.~~

28 ~~(b) Furniture and equipment. The total authorization for~~
29 ~~the additional capital projects in the category of public~~
30 ~~improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original~~
31 ~~movable furniture and equipment to complete public improvement~~
32 ~~projects itemized in section 4 and to be acquired by the~~
33 ~~Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and~~
34 ~~to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$91,517,000.~~

35 ~~(c) Transportation assistance. The total authorization for~~
36 ~~the capital projects in the category of transportation~~
37 ~~assistance projects itemized in section 5 with respect to which~~

~~an interest is to be acquired in or constructed by the Department of Transportation, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$695,894,000.~~

~~(d) Redevelopment assistance. The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of redevelopment assistance and redevelopment assistance capital projects itemized in section 6 for capital grants by the Department of Community and Economic Development, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$2,037,078,000.~~

~~(e) Flood control. The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of flood control projects itemized in section 7 and to be constructed by the Department of Environmental Protection, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$44,458,000.~~

~~(f) Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation. The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation projects itemized in section 8 and to be constructed by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, its successors or assigns, and to be financed from revenues in the Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund shall be \$98,837,000.~~

~~(g) Game Fund projects. The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 9 to be acquired by the Pennsylvania Game Commission and to be financed from current revenues of the Game Fund pursuant to executive authorizations shall be \$1,927,000.~~

~~(h) Fish and Boat Fund projects. The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 10 to be acquired or developed by~~

1 the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission and to be financed
2 from current revenues of the Boat Fund and the Fish Fund
3 pursuant to executive authorization shall be \$2,238,000.

4 (i) State Forestry Bridge projects. The total authorization
5 for the capital projects in the category of State forestry
6 bridge projects itemized in section 11 to be constructed by the
7 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, its successors
8 or assigns, and to be financed by oil company franchise tax
9 revenues pursuant to 75 Pa.C.S. § 9502(a)(2)(iv) (relating to
10 imposition of tax), shall be \$31,228,000.

11 (j) Drug Forfeiture Funds projects. The total authorization
12 for the capital project in the category of public improvement
13 projects itemized in section 12 to be acquired or developed by
14 the Department of General Services for the Pennsylvania State
15 Police, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by drug
16 forfeiture revenues shall be \$300,000.

14 OTHER DAYS DURING THAT SEASON, OTHER THAN SUNDAYS OR MONDAYS, AS

27 UPON FIVE DAYS' NOTICE TO FULFILL CONFERENCE OR TELEVISION
28 OPPORTUNITIES, AND TO PROVIDE FOR STADIUM USAGE BY THE TEAMS FOR
29 WALK-THROUGHS AND/OR PRACTICES ON THE DAY BEFORE TEMPLE'S
30 FOOTBALL GAME DAYS.
