## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in boards and offices, establishing
- the Independent Energy Office.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Part V of Title 71 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 18 § 4301. Definitions.

- 1 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 2 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 3 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 4 <u>"Committee." The Independent Energy Office Selection and</u>
- 5 Organization Committee.
- 6 "Director." The Director of the Independent Energy Office.
- 7 "Office." The Independent Energy Office established under
- 8 <u>section 4302 (relating to office established).</u>
- 9 § 4302. Office established.
- 10 The Independent Energy Office is established as a nonpartisan
- 11 independent agency.
- 12 § 4303. Duties of office.
- 13 (a) Mandatory. -- The office shall:
- (1) Plan recommendations that cover coal, natural gas
- and oil, electric power, energy efficiency, solar, wind,
- 16 hydro, geothermal, biomass, landfill gas and renewable
- 17 natural gas.
- 18 (2) Analyze policies, regulations and laws that relate
- 19 to energy generation, production or distribution.
- 20 (3) Provide at least one Statewide energy report each
- 21 legislative session presented to the General Assembly.
- 22 (4) Formulate and review the use of fossil, renewable
- and energy efficiency initiatives designed to advance energy
- resource development opportunities and provide energy
- services to businesses, communities and homeowners in this
- 26 Commonwealth.
- 27 (b) Discretionary. -- The office may:
- 28 (1) Provide independent studies on other State energy
- policies to recommend to the Commonwealth.
- 30 (2) Track energy use, production and generation

- 1 <u>statistics from year to year.</u>
- 2 (3) Work with the General Assembly to establish a
- 3 Statewide energy plan.
- 4 § 4304. Committee.
- 5 The Independent Energy Office Selection and Organization
- 6 <u>Committee is established within the office. The committee shall</u>
- 7 <u>create and publish qualifications for director of the office.</u>
- 8 The committee shall consist of the following members:
- 9 <u>(1) The President pro tempore of the Senate.</u>
- 10 (2) The Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 11 (3) The Majority Leader of the Senate.
- 12 (4) The Minority Leader of the Senate.
- 13 (5) The Majority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 14 (6) The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 15 (7) The chairperson of the Environmental Resources and
- 16 <u>Energy Committee of the Senate.</u>
- 17 (8) The minority chairperson of the Environmental
- 18 Resources and Energy Committee of the Senate.
- 19 (9) The chairperson of the Environmental Resources and
- 20 <u>Energy Committee of the House of Representatives.</u>
- 21 (10) The minority chairperson of the Environmental
- 22 Resources and Energy Committee of the House of
- 23 Representatives.
- 24 § 4305. Appointment.
- 25 (a) Director.--The office shall be headed by a director
- 26 appointed by the committee by May 30, 2025. The appointment
- 27 <u>shall be made without regard to political affiliation and solely</u>
- 28 on the basis of fitness to perform the duties of the office
- 29 <u>based on qualifications published by the committee.</u>
- 30 (b) Deputy director. -- The director shall appoint a deputy

- 1 director who shall perform such duties as assigned by the
- 2 director and who shall, during the absence or incapacity of the
- 3 <u>director or a vacancy, act as the director.</u>
- 4 (c) Term. -- The term of office of the director shall be six
- 5 years. An individual appointed as director to fill a vacancy
- 6 prior to the expiration of a term shall serve only for the
- 7 <u>unexpired portion of that term. An individual serving as</u>
- 8 <u>director at the expiration of a term may continue to serve until</u>
- 9 <u>a successor is appointed.</u>
- 10 (d) Removal.--The director may be removed by a concurrent
- 11 resolution passed by the Senate and the House of
- 12 <u>Representatives.</u>
- 13 § 4306. Powers and duties of director.
- 14 (a) Personnel.--The director shall appoint and fix the
- 15 compensation of personnel as necessary to carry out the duties
- 16 and functions of the office. All personnel of the office shall
- 17 be appointed without regard to political affiliation and solely
- 18 on the basis of their fitness to perform their duties.
- 19 (b) Experts and consultants. -- In carrying out the duties and
- 20 functions of the office, the director may procure the temporary
- 21 or intermittent services of attorneys, experts or consultants or
- 22 organization thereof by contract.
- 23 § 4307. Records.
- 24 The office shall be a legislative agency for purposes of the
- 25 act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-
- 26 Know Law.
- 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
