10	Section 1. The definition of "information technology
11	platform" in section 2 of the act of November 3, 2022 (P.L.2158,
12	No.158), known as the Overdose Mapping Act, is amended and the

14	Section 2. Definitions.
15	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
16	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
17	context clearly indicates otherwise:

19	"EMS provider." As defined in 35 Pa.C.S. § 8103 (relating to
20	<u>definitions).</u>

"Information technology platform." As follows: 1 The [Overdose Information Network (ODIN)] overdose 2 (1)3 information network. Any other platform approved by the Pennsylvania 4 (2) State Police to capture real-time overdose reporting or the 5 Department of Health to capture EMS provider reporting. 6 * * * 7 8 Section 2. Section 3(a) of the act is amended by adding a 9 paragraph to read: 10 Section 3. Establishment and design. 11 (a) Establishment.--The Pennsylvania State Police shall 12 launch an overdose information network for the purpose of 13 electronically tracking known or suspected overdoses in this 14 Commonwealth. The following apply: 15 * * * 16 (8) The Department of Health shall coordinate with the 17 Pennsylvania State Police to ensure that real-time overdose 18 reporting entered by an EMS provider into an information 19 technology platform, other than the overdose information 20 network, is promptly transferred to the overdose information 21 network. * * * 22 23 Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read: 24 Section 4.1. Entry requirements for EMS providers. 25 (a) Reporting by EMS providers. -- An EMS provider who 26 encounters a known or suspected overdose shall access an information technology platform to report and document the 27 incident in accordance with subsection (b) within 72 hours of 28 29 the overdose. 1	suspected overdose, an authorized user shall document the
2	following information in an information technology platform:
3	(1) The date and time of the overdose.
4	(2) The location where the overdose occurred.
5	(3) The known or suspected controlled substances
6	administered to or inhaled, ingested, imbibed or injected by
7	the overdose victim.
8	(4) Whether an overdose reversal drug was administered
9	and, if so, the type of overdose reversal drug administered,
10	the number of doses administered and the method of
11	administration.
12	(5) Whether the confirmed or suspected overdose was
13	fatal or nonfatal.
14	(c) Other reporting requirementsAn authorized user's
15	report of information about an overdose under this act does not
16	preempt or replace any other reporting requirement of law
17	applicable to the authorized user.
18	Section 4. This act shall take effect in six months.

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
