AN ACT

- Defining and providing for the licensing and regulation of
 private ACADEMIC schools; establishing REESTABLISHING the <State Board of Private Academic Schools; imposing penalties;
 and making repeals.</pre>
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- 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 13 hereby enacts as follows:
- 14 Section 1. Short title.
- 15 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Private
- 16 Academic Schools Act.
- 17 Section 2. Definitions.
- 18 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 19 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 20 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 21 "Admissions representative." A person acting for a private
- 22 licensed school who, for a consideration, at locations off the
- 23 premises of the school solicits or procures through an
- 24 enrollment agreement an individual in this Commonwealth to
- 25 enroll in a private licensed school.
- 26 "Annual." Twelve months from the date of initial licensure.
- 27 "Board." The State Board of Private Academic Schools.
- 28 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 29 Commonwealth.
- 30 "Enrollment agreement." A written contract between the

- 1 student and the private academic school.
- 2 "Private academic school" or "school." A school maintained,
- 3 or classes conducted, for the purpose of offering instruction
- 4 for a consideration, profit or tuition, to five or more pupils
- 5 at one and the same time, or to twenty-five or more pupils
- 6 during any school year, the purpose of which is to educate an
- 7 individual generally or specially or to prepare an individual
- 8 for more advanced study, and shall include all schools engaged
- 9 in such education, except private trade schools, private
- 10 business schools, private correspondence schools, private music
- 11 schools, private dance schools, private art schools, private
- 12 dramatic art schools, private schools of charm or poise, private
- 13 driver training schools, or any type of private school which is
- 14 nonacademic in character.
- 15 "Registered school." The official designation for an out of
- 16 State school which has met all the requirements of the board for
- 17 approval to enroll Pennsylvania residents in its resident school
- 18 or home study course.
- 19 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 20 Section 3. State Board of Private Academic Schools.
- 21 (a) Establishment of board. -- There is hereby created within
- 22 the department a departmental administrative board to be known
- 23 as the State Board of Private Academic Schools. The board shall
- 24 consist of nine members, who shall be appointed by the
- 25 secretary. The composition of the board shall include at least
- 26 one parent of a student in a licensed academic school. The terms
- 27 of appointment shall be for three years.
- 28 (b) Quorum.--Five members of the board shall constitute a
- 29 quorum. The board shall select annually a chairperson from among
- 30 its members.

- 1 (c) Administrative support.--Administrative support for the
- 2 board shall be provided by the department in accordance with
- 3 section 214 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
- 4 as The Administrative Code of 1929. The department shall
- 5 periodically consult with the board regarding its administrative
- 6 needs.
- 7 (d) Compensation and expenses.--Members of the board shall
- 8 receive \$60 per diem for each day actually devoted to work of
- 9 the board. The members shall be reimbursed for reasonable
- 10 travel, hotel and other necessary expenses incurred in the
- 11 performance of their duties in accordance with Commonwealth
- 12 regulations.
- 13 (e) Forfeiture of membership. -- A member who fails to attend
- 14 three consecutive board meetings shall forfeit membership on the
- 15 board unless the secretary, upon written request from the
- 16 member, determines that the member shall be excused from a
- 17 meeting or meetings for reasons of illness or death of a family
- 18 member.
- 19 (f) Meetings and records.--The board shall meet at such
- 20 times and places as it shall determine is necessary for the
- 21 proper conduct of its work. Special meetings may be called by
- 22 the chairperson or at the request of a majority of the members
- 23 of the board dependent upon the availability of funds to cover
- 24 costs. Board records and administrative records for private
- 25 licensed school ACADEMIC SCHOOLS shall be maintained in
- 26 Harrisburg.
- 27 (q) Documents.--Certificates of licensure and other official

- 28 documents approved by the board shall be issued by the
- 29 department.
- 30 Section 4. Powers and duties of board.

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- 1 (a) Licensure, policies, etc.--The board shall have the
- 2 power and its duty shall be to approve or disapprove the initial
- 3 and renewal licensure or registry or both, of schools; to
- 4 suspend or revoke the licensure or registry, or both, of
- 5 schools; to approve or disapprove the licensing of admissions <---

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- 6 representatives; to establish qualifications for instructors,
- 7 administrators and supervisors TEACHERS, PROFESSIONAL STAFF AND <---
- 8 DIRECTORS; to adopt broad policies and principles and to
- 9 establish standards, rules and regulations. The regulations
- 10 shall provide for a method of school closure.
- 11 (b) Disposition of student records.--The board shall require
- 12 every applicant for initial or renewal licensure to provide a
- 13 written statement describing arrangements for disposition of
- 14 student records in the event of closure. It shall be the duty of
- 15 the board and the department to assist in the execution of the
- 16 arrangements when necessary. Priority shall be given to plans
- 17 for retention of the records with existing private licensed
- 18 schools in the same geographical area.
- 19 (c) Statistical report. The board shall submit annually to
- 20 the Education Committee of the Senate and the Education
- 21 Committee of the House of Representatives a report containing
- 22 statistical data on tuition rates and the percentage of students
- 23 completing programs of study. Private licensed or registered
- 24 schools shall submit this information to the department by
- 25 September 30 of each year for the preceding academic year ending
- 26 June 30.
- 27 (e) (C) Enforcement by department.--The regulations
- 28 promulgated by the board shall be enforced by the department.
- 29 The department may submit to individual experts for review,
- 30 programs and courses and financial statements proposed or

- 1 offered by a school.
- 2 Section 5. Optional licensing of private schools.
- 3 A school which is not required to obtain a license may apply <
- 4 for a license and, upon approval and issuance of the license,
- 5 shall be subject to the provisions of this act. It may
- 6 voluntarily surrender its license and revert to its original
- 7 status.
- 8 LICENSING SHALL NOT APPLY TO COLLEGES OR UNIVERSITIES, TO
- 9 SCHOOLS MAINTAINED OR CLASSES CONDUCTED BY EMPLOYERS FOR THEIR
- 10 OWN EMPLOYEES WHERE NO FEE OR TUITION IS CHARGED, TO SCHOOLS OR
- 11 CLASSES OWNED OR OPERATED BY OR UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF BONA FIDE
- 12 RELIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS OR BY THE COMMONWEALTH OR ANY POLITICAL
- 13 SUBDIVISION THEREOF, TO SCHOOLS FOR THE BLIND, DEAF AND DUMB
- 14 RECEIVING COMMONWEALTH APPROPRIATIONS, OR TO SCHOOLS ACCREDITED
- 15 BY ACCREDITING ASSOCIATIONS, APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF
- 16 EDUCATION, BUT SUCH SCHOOLS MAY CHOOSE TO APPLY FOR A LICENSE
- 17 AND, UPON APPROVAL AND ISSUANCE THEREOF, SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE
- 18 PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT.
- 19 Section 6. Mandatory licensing of private academic schools.and
- 20 <u>admissions representatives.</u>
- 21 A private academic school requiring licensure shall not
- 22 operate within this Commonwealth unless the school has obtained
- 23 from the board a license issued in the prescribed manner and
- 24 form.
- 25 Section 7. Application for license.
- 26 (a) General rule.--Before any license is issued to a private
- 27 ACADEMIC school, a verified application shall be made, in
- 28 writing, to the board on a form prepared and furnished by the
- 29 department. The

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30 (B) APPLICATION CONTENTS.--THE application shall require a <--

The title or name and address of the school or, 2 3 GRADES AND classes together with the name of the owners and 4 controlling officers. 5 (2) The general and specific fields of instruction which will be offered and the purposes of such instruction. 6 7 (3) The place or places where instruction will be given. (4) A specific listing of the equipment, INSTRUCTIONAL 8 MATERIALS and staff available for instruction in each program 9 THE SCHOOL. 10 <----11 The maximum enrollment to be accommodated on equipment available in each program. 12 13 The qualifications of instructors, administrators 14 and supervisors TEACHERS, PROFESSIONAL STAFF AND DIRECTORS in 15 each program. 16 Financial resources available to equip and maintain 17 the school. 18 (8) An agreement to abide by reasonable service and 19 business ethics prescribed by the board. 20 (9) For relicensure, statistical data on tuition rates 21 and percentage of students completing programs of study. 22 (10) (9) Any additional information the board may deem 23 necessary to enable it to determine the adequacy of the 24 program of instruction, the business integrity and related 25 matters. 26 An application must be completed for board consideration. 27 (b) (C) Financial responsibility. -- Each private academic 28 school shall demonstrate to the board that it has adequate resources or forms of surety available for the purpose of 29 reimbursing unearned tuition due students whenever the licensed

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statement showing:

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- 1 or registered school ceases to operate. The form of financial
- 2 responsibility or surety established by the private licensed or
- 3 registered school shall be subject to approval by the board. The
- 4 board shall promulgate regulations under this act establishing
- 5 the levels and forms of financial responsibility or surety that
- 6 the private licensed or registered school is permitted to
- 7 establish. Until such regulations take effect, the surety
- 8 requirements in existence on the effective date of this act
- 9 shall continue to be enforced.
- 10 (c) (D) Licensing rules.--The board shall prescribe rules
- 11 and regulations for the licensing of admissions representatives.
- 12 Section 8. Issuance and renewal.
- 13 (a) General rule. -- The department shall issue an original
- 14 license to the application APPLICANT if the board finds that the <-

- 15 application and the school or class or admissions representative <
- 16 for which a license is sought comply with the provisions of this
- 17 act and with the rules and regulations promulgated under this
- 18 act.
- 19 (b) Duration and renewal.--Each original school license
- 20 issued shall be effective from the date of issue until the first
- 21 day SAME DATE of the month of original issue the following year <---
- 22 and shall be renewed annually thereafter on a form prepared and
- 23 furnished by the department.
- 24 (c) License not transferable.--Each private licensed
- 25 ACADEMIC school shall have a separate license which shall not be <-
- 26 transferable.
- 27 Section 9. Licenses restricted.
- Any license issued to a private ACADEMIC school shall
- 29 restrict a private licensed ACADEMIC school to the program,
- 30 courses or classes specifically indicated in the application for

- 1 a license. A private licensed ACADEMIC school shall present a <-
- 2 required supplementary application for approval of CHANGE OF
- 3 LOCATION, additional programs, courses or classes GRADES in <-
- 4 which it desired DESIRES to offer instruction during the <-
- 5 effective period of its license.
- 6 Section 10. License fees.
- 7 (a) General rule.--The board shall set ADOPT REGULATIONS <--

- 8 ESTABLISHING a fee schedule for the original school license and
- 9 the annual school license renewal. Those fees shall be based
- 10 upon enrollment criteria AND CATEGORY OF LICENSE.
- 11 (b) Disposition of fees.--License fees shall be placed in
- 12 the General Fund.
- 13 (c) Fee not refundable.--If a license is denied, suspended
- 14 or revoked, the license fee shall not be refunded. If the board
- 15 determines that a license is not required, the license fee may
- 16 be refunded.
- 17 Section 11. Directory of private academic schools.
- 18 The department shall maintain a list of private academic
- 19 schools which shall be available to the public.
- 20 Section 12. Requirements for licensure and operation.
- 21 (a) Inspection. -- No private ACADEMIC school may be granted a <--
- 22 license or permitted to continue to operate under a granted
- 23 license unless it permits the board and its representatives to
- 24 inspect the school or classes and makes available to the board,
- 25 at any time when requested to do so, full information pertaining
- 26 to the operation of the school.
- 27 (b) Display of license. -- The school shall prominently
- 28 display on the premises the current approved license where it
- 29 may be inspected by students, visitors and designated officials
- 30 of the board.

1 (c) Advertising. The ADVERTISING AND REPRESENTATIONS. --2. THE advertising and representations made by any 3 person representing the school or classes shall neither 4 misrepresent any fact relating to the school nor mislead 5 prospective students. 6 (d) Advertisements and representations. <_ 7 (1) (2) A school shall not use any name, other than its 8 licensed name, for advertising or publicity purposes. A 9 school shall not advertise or imply that it is "supervised," "recommended," "endorsed," "accredited" or "approved" by the 10 11 secretary, the department or the board. 12 (2) (3) A school shall not claim or imply that it is <-13 endorsed by colleges, universities or other institutions of 14 higher learning. 15 (3) (4) A school shall not claim or imply that it will 16 quarantee admission to any educational institution or 17 employment upon completion of its course OR program. 18 (4) (5) A school shall not, by means of blind 19 advertisements or advertisements in the help wanted or other 20 employment columns of newspapers and other publications, 21 solicit prospective students to enroll in the school. 22 (e) (D) Condition of premises. -- The premises, equipment and 23 conditions of the school or classes shall be adequate, safe and sanitary in accordance with standards of the Commonwealth or any 24 25 of its political subdivisions that are applicable to the 26 premises and equipment. 27 Section 13. Enforcement, refusal, suspension or revocation of 28 license. 29 General rule. -- The board shall have the power to take appropriate necessary action for the enforcement of its

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- 1 policies, rules and regulations.
- 2 (b) Suspension REFUSAL TO ISSUE, SUSPENSION OF and

3 revocation of license. -- The board shall have the power to refuse

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- 4 to issue, suspend or revoke a license if it finds that:
- 5 (1) The licensee has violated any of the provisions of
- 6 this act or any of the rules and regulations of the board.
- 7 (2) The applicant or licensee has knowingly presented to
- 8 the board false, incomplete or misleading information
- 9 relating to licensure.
- 10 (3) The applicant or licensee has pleaded guilty,
- 11 entered a plea of nolo contendere or has been found guilty of
- 12 a crime constituting a misdemeanor or felony by a judge or
- jury in any state or Federal court.
- 14 (4) The applicant or licensee has failed or refused to
- permit the board or its representatives to inspect the school
- or classes or has failed or refused to make available to the
- board, at any time when requested to do so, full information
- 18 pertaining to any or all items of information contained in an
- 19 application for license or pertaining to the operation of the
- 20 private licensed ACADEMIC school.
- 21 (5) The applicant has failed or refused to submit to the
- 22 board an application for license or renewal in the manner and
- 23 form prescribed.
- 24 (6) A private academic school has failed or refused to
- 25 PROMINENTLY display on the school's premises the current
- approved license where it may be inspected by students,
- 27 visitors or designated officials of the board.
- 28 (7) The applicant or licensee has failed to provide or
- 29 maintain premises, equipment or conditions which are
- 30 adequate, safe and sanitary in accordance with such standards

- of the Commonwealth or any of its political subdivisions that are applicable to the premises and equipment.
- 3 (8) The licensee has perpetrated fraud or deceit in 4 written or oral advertising of the school or classes or in 5 presenting to prospective students written or oral 6 information relating to the school or classes, employment 7 opportunities or opportunities for enrollment in institutions 8 of higher learning.
- 9 (9) The licensee has failed to provide and maintain
 10 adequate premises, equipment, INSTRUCTIONAL materials or <—
 11 supplies or has exceeded the maximum enrollment for which the
 12 school was licensed or program or course approved. <—
 - (10) The licensee has failed to provide OR DIRECT and <-maintain adequate standards of instruction or an adequate and <-qualified administrative, supervisory or instructional staff.

 NUMBER OF QUALIFIED TEACHERS OR PROFESSIONAL STAFF. <--
 - (11) The applicant or licensee is unable to provide and maintain financial resources in sufficient amount to equip and maintain adequately and effectively the school or classes.
 - (12) The licensee has moved the school into new premises or facilities without notifying the board and before receiving approval from the board.
- 24 (13) The licensee has offered training or instruction in <--25 programs or courses which have not been approved and
 26 authorized by the board.
 - (14) There was a change in the ownership of the school without notification to and approval from the board.
- 29 (15) The school was operated or conducted under an 30 ownership arrangement not approved by the board.

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- 1 (16) The licensee has had the license of a school
- 2 suspended or revoked in THIS COMMONWEALTH OR IN another
- 3 state.
- 4 (c) Adjudicatory procedure. -- The procedure to be followed in

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- 5 the refusal, suspension and revocation of licenses and in
- 6 appeals taken from those actions shall be in accordance with
- 7 Title 2 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes (relating to
- 8 administrative law and procedure).
- 9 (d) Reinstatement of license.--Unless directed to do so by
- 10 court order, the board shall not, for a period of five years
- 11 following revocation, reinstate the license of a private
- 12 licensed school or admissions representative ACADEMIC SCHOOL
- 13 which has been revoked. The school or representative shall be
- 14 required to reapply as a new licensee in accordance with the
- 15 provisions of this act.
- 16 Section 14. Promulgation of rules and regulations.
- 17 The board shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to
- 18 carry out the purposes of this act. The rules and regulations of
- 19 the State Board of Private Academic Schools in force on the
- 20 effective date of this act, and not countermanded by this act,
- 21 shall remain in effect until repealed or amended by the board,
- 22 but not for a period of more than one year.
- 23 Section 15. Penalties.
- 24 (a) Summary offense.--A person who violates or fails to
- 25 comply with this act or a rule, regulation or standard
- 26 promulgated under this act commits a summary offense and shall,
- 27 upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than
- 28 \$300.
- 29 (b) Civil penalty. -- In addition to any other penalty
- 30 provided in this act, the board may, by a majority vote of its

- 1 statutorily authorized membership, levy a civil penalty of up to
- 2 \$1,000 on any licensee who violates any provision of this act or

- 3 any person who operates a private licensed ACADEMIC school
- 4 without being properly licensed under this act. Prior to the
- 5 collection of the penalty, the licensee or person shall have
- 6 access to the hearing procedure provided in Title 2 of the
- 7 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes (relating to administrative
- 8 law and procedure).
- 9 Section 16. Existing licenses to remain in force.
- 10 Licenses issued by the State Board of Private Academic
- 11 Schools prior to the effective date of this act shall remain in
- 12 force for the period of the license.
- 13 Section 17. Repeals.
- 14 The following acts and parts of acts are repealed:
- 15 Sections 455 and 606-A(1) of the act of April 9, 1929
- 16 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.
- Act of 1947 (P.L.951, No.401), entitled, as amended, "An act
- 18 defining and providing for the licensing and regulation of
- 19 private academic schools; conferring powers and imposing duties
- 20 on the State Board of Private Academic Schools; and imposing
- 21 penalties."
- 22 SECTION 18. REESTABLISHMENT OF BOARD.
- THIS ACT, WITH RESPECT TO THE STATE BOARD OF PRIVATE ACADEMIC
- 24 SCHOOLS, CONSTITUTES THE LEGISLATION REQUIRED TO REESTABLISH AN
- 25 AGENCY UNDER THE ACT OF DECEMBER 22, 1981 (P.L.508, NO.142),
- 26 KNOWN AS THE SUNSET ACT.
- 27 SECTION 19. EXISTING MEMBERS TO CONTINUE TO SERVE.
- 28 THE PRESENT MEMBERS OF THE EXISTING STATE BOARD OF PRIVATE
- 29 ACADEMIC SCHOOLS, AS OF DECEMBER 31, 1987, SHALL CONTINUE TO
- 30 SERVE AS MEMBERS UNTIL THEIR PRESENT TERMS OF OFFICE EXPIRE AND

- 1 UNTIL THEIR SUCCESSORS ARE APPOINTED AND QUALIFIED.
- 2 SECTION 20. EXISTING FEES TO REMAIN IN EFFECT.
- 3 EACH FEE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PRIVATE ACADEMIC SCHOOLS IN
- 4 EFFECT ON DECEMBER 31, 1986, SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL
- 5 REPEALED OR AMENDED BY THE BOARD.
- 6 SECTION 21. RETROACTIVITY.
- 7 THIS ACT SHALL BE RETROACTIVE TO JANUARY 1, 1988, IF ENACTED

- 8 AFTER THAT DATE.
- 9 Section 18 22. Effective date.

10 This act shall take effect January 1, 1988.
