AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," in charter schools, providing for 5 moratorium; and further providing for applicability of other 6 provisions of act and regulations. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 11 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 12 section to read:
- 13 <u>Section 1733-A. Moratorium.--(a) Notwithstanding any other</u>
- 14 provision of law to the contrary, a moratorium is established on
- 15 the effective date of this section for the review of the
- 16 <u>following applications submitted after the effective date of</u>
- 17 this section:
- 18 (1) Review of an application for a new charter school by the
- 19 State Charter School Appeal Board.
- 20 (2) Review of an application for a new cyber charter school
- 21 by the department.

- 1 (3) Review of an application for a new cyber charter school
- 2 by the State Charter School Appeal Board.
- 3 (b) The moratorium established in subsection (a) shall not
- 4 apply to any application for the renewal of a charter for a
- 5 <u>charter school or a cyber charter school.</u>
- 6 (c) (1) The moratorium established in subsection (a) shall
- 7 <u>expire upon the earlier of the following:</u>
- 8 (i) June 30, 2015; or
- 9 <u>(ii)</u> June 30 of the school year where the following have
- 10 been implemented to more fairly and accurately measure the
- 11 academic performance of students, schools, school districts and
- 12 <u>educators:</u>
- (A) Replacement of the Commonwealth's State Assessment
- 14 System, including the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment,
- 15 the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment-Modified and the
- 16 Pennsylvania Alternate System of Assessment.
- 17 (B) Replacement or revision of the Pennsylvania
- 18 Accountability System and the Pennsylvania Value Added
- 19 Assessment System.
- 20 (2) Replacement and revision under paragraph (1) (ii) (A) and
- 21 (B) shall incorporate the following:
- 22 (i) Utilization of multiple measures of student performance
- 23 that can be used to quide and inform educational practice and
- 24 for accountability purposes to include, but not be limited to,
- 25 the following:
- 26 (A) Student achievement.
- 27 (B) Gains in student achievement.
- 28 (C) Reductions in the student achievement gap.
- 29 (D) School attendance rates.
- 30 (E) Graduation rates.

- 1 (ii) Utilization of at least five (5) classifications of
- 2 <u>academic performance to recognize a range of academic</u>
- 3 performance from a high level through a continuous range to a
- 4 <u>low-level to provide improved targeting of rewards for high-</u>
- 5 performing schools and school districts and assistance for low-
- 6 performing schools and school districts.
- 7 (iii) Incentives for schools to assist students to improve
- 8 <u>their performance.</u>
- 9 (iv) Utilization of differentiated systems of support to the
- 10 lowest-performing schools and school districts, including
- 11 professional development that is targeted to the deficits of
- 12 each school and school district.
- 13 <u>(v) Utilization of reasonable and realistic implementation</u>
- 14 goals that ensure that the Commonwealth, the school districts
- 15 and schools have the capacity to fully implement the
- 16 accountability system and act on the results.
- 17 (vi) Application of the replacement assessment systems to
- 18 each public school, charter school, regional charter school,
- 19 cyber charter school, area vocational-technical school and
- 20 nonpublic school in this Commonwealth to provide for the
- 21 assessment of every student in the tested grades.
- 22 (3) Replacement and revision under paragraph (1)(ii)(A) and
- 23 (B) must receive approval from the United States Department of
- 24 Education.
- 25 Section 2. Section 1749-A(a)(1) of the act, added June 29,
- 26 2002 (P.L.524, No.88), is amended to read:
- 27 Section 1749-A. Applicability of other provisions of this act
- and of other acts and regulations.
- 29 (a) General requirements. -- Cyber charter schools shall be
- 30 subject to the following:

- 2 436, 443, 510, 518, 527, 708, 752, 753, [755,] 771, 776, 777,
- 3 808, 809, 810, 1109, 1111, 1112(a), 1205.1, 1205.2, 1301,

- 5 1523, 1531, 1547, 1702-A, 1703-A, 1714-A, 1715-A, 1716-A,

- 7 1727-A, 1729-A, 1730-A, 1731-A(a)(1) and (b), 1733-A and
- 8 2014-A and Articles XII-A, XIII-A and XIV.

- 10 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
