- 6 Section 1. Section 3253(c) of Title 58 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes, added February 14, 2012 (P.L.87, No.13),
- 8 is amended to read:
- 9 § 3253. Enforcement orders.
- 10 * * *
- 11 (c) Written notice.--
- 12 <u>(1)</u> Prior to suspension or revocation of a well permit
- or registration, the department shall serve written notice on
- 14 the well operator or its agent, stating specifically the
- 15 statutory provision, regulation or other reason relied upon,
- 16 along with factual circumstances surrounding the alleged
- 17 violation. If the department suspends or revokes the permit
- 18 or registration, the department may order the operator to cap

1	the well if the likely result of the violation is an unsafe
2	operation or environmental damage.
3	(2) If both of the following apply:
4	(i) the department issues an enforcement order for a
5	continuing violation of any of the following:
6	(A) this chapter;
7	(B) the Clean Streams Law;
8	(C) the Solid Waste Management Act; or
9	(D) any other statute administered by the
10	<pre>department;</pre>
11	<u>and</u>
12	(ii) the likely result of the violation is an unsafe
13	operation or environmental damage,
14	then the department shall provide a copy of the enforcement
15	order and written notice to the surface owner, if the surface
16	is owned by a person other than the well operator, and all
17	surface users. The notice shall specifically state the
18	statutory provision, regulation or other reason relied upon
19	and the factual circumstances surrounding the violation which
20	serve as the basis for the enforcement order.

22	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
