AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in high schools, providing for high 5
- school graduation requirements. 6
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows: 8
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- Section 1613.1. High School Graduation Requirements. -- (a) 12
- 13 High school graduation requirements and revisions to them shall
- be approved by a school entity's governing board by July 1, 14
- 15 2018. A copy of the requirements shall be published and
- 16 distributed to students, parents and quardians. Copies of the
- 17 requirements also shall be available in each school building or
- on each school entity's publicly accessible Internet website. 18
- Changes to high school graduation requirements shall be 19

- 1 published and distributed to students, parents and quardians and
- 2 <u>made available in each school building or on each school</u>
- 3 <u>entity's publicly accessible Internet website immediately</u>
- 4 following approval by the governing board of the school entity.
- 5 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
- 6 contrary, beginning in the 2018-2019 school year, each school
- 7 <u>entity</u>, <u>if applicable</u>, <u>shall adopt and implement requirements</u>
- 8 for high school graduation that, at minimum, include:
- 9 <u>(1) Course completion and grades.</u>
- 10 (2) Demonstration of proficiency as determined by the school
- 11 entity, if applicable, in each of the State academic standards
- 12 <u>not assessed by a State assessment.</u>
- 13 (3) Successful completion of each of the following State
- 14 <u>academic standards: mathematics, specifically algebra I; English</u>
- 15 <u>language arts</u>, specifically literature; and science and
- 16 <u>technology and environment and ecology</u>, as determined through
- 17 any one of the following:
- 18 (i) Attainment of an established composite score on the
- 19 Algebra I, Biology and Literature Keystone Exams. Each student
- 20 who satisfies the requirements of this section in this manner
- 21 must achieve basic or above on each of the three Keystone Exams.
- 22 The secretary shall establish and identify the satisfactory
- 23 <u>composite score a student must achieve in order to meet the</u>
- 24 requirements of this section. The composite score and any
- 25 changes to the composite score must be approved by the State
- 26 board.
- 27 <u>(ii) For each Keystone Exam on which a student did not</u>
- 28 achieve proficiency, completion and attainment of an established
- 29 score on an approved alternative assessment that includes
- 30 academic content aligned to the following State academic

- 1 standards: mathematics, specifically algebra I; English language
- 2 arts, specifically literature; and science and technology and
- 3 <u>environment and ecology, specifically biology. The secretary</u>
- 4 <u>shall identify approved alternative assessments for each content</u>
- 5 <u>area of algebra I, biology and literature, if applicable, and</u>
- 6 shall establish the score a student must attain on each approved
- 7 <u>alternative assessment in order to meet the requirements of this</u>
- 8 section. The State board shall approve the score a student must
- 9 attain on each approved alternative assessment, any changes to
- 10 the score to be attained, the list of approved alternative
- 11 assessments and any changes to the list.
- 12 (iii) For each Keystone Exam on which a student does not
- 13 <u>achieve proficiency</u>, completion of locally established grade-
- 14 based requirements for the associated academic content area and
- 15 demonstration of three pieces of evidence that reflect readiness
- 16 for meaningful postsecondary engagement, consistent with a
- 17 student's goals and career plan as represented in the student's
- 18 career portfolio. The department shall provide quidance as to
- 19 what may be considered as evidence of readiness for meaningful
- 20 postsecondary engagement.
- 21 (c) A CTE concentrator who satisfies the requirements set
- 22 forth in section 121(c) and (d) shall be granted and issued a
- 23 <u>high school diploma by the school entity.</u>
- 24 (d) Children with disabilities who satisfactorily complete a
- 25 <u>special education program developed by an individualized</u>
- 26 education program team under the Individuals With Disabilities
- 27 Education Act (Public Law 91-230, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq.) and
- 28 22 Pa. Code Ch. 14 (relating to special education services and
- 29 programs) shall be granted and issued a regular high school
- 30 diploma by the school entity, if applicable. This subsection

- 1 applies if the special education program of a child with a
- 2 disability does not otherwise meet the requirements of this
- 3 <u>section</u>.
- 4 (e) For purposes of this section, a student shall be deemed
- 5 proficient in the State academic standards whenever the student
- 6 satisfies the requirements of subsection (b), regardless of the
- 7 student's grade level or age.
- 8 (f) A student who has achieved a score of proficient or
- 9 <u>advanced on a Keystone Exam is not permitted to retake the exam.</u>
- 10 (q) The performance level demonstrated in each of the State
- 11 academic standards in subsection (b), including the highest
- 12 <u>performance level demonstrated by a student on the associated</u>
- 13 <u>Keystone Exam, may be included on a student's transcript.</u>
- 14 (h) The release of individual student Pennsylvania System of
- 15 School Assessment or Keystone Exam scores to the department or
- 16 other Commonwealth entities is prohibited in accordance with 22
- 17 Pa. Code § 4.51(f) (relating to State assessment system).
- 18 (i) Beginning in the 2016-2017 school year, a school entity
- 19 is not required to provide and a student is not required to
- 20 complete supplemental instruction as required by 22 Pa. Code §§
- 21 4.24(k) (relating to high school graduation requirements) and
- 22 4.51b(f) (relating to Keystone Exams) or any other provision of
- 23 law.
- 24 (j) A student shall not be required to participate in a
- 25 project-based assessment pursuant to 22 Pa. Code §§ 4.24 and
- 26 4.51c (relating to project-based assessment) or any other
- 27 provision of law.
- 28 (k) A school entity shall determine whether a student who
- 29 transfers from an out-of-State school having demonstrated
- 30 proficiency in coursework and assessments aligned with the State

- 1 academic standards assessed by each Keystone Exam may satisfy
- 2 the requirements of subsection (b) subject to quidance developed
- 3 by the secretary.
- 4 (1) As used in this section:
- 5 "Career portfolio" shall mean a future education and career
- 6 plan required under the Career Education and Work Standards set
- 7 <u>forth in 22 Pa. Code Ch. 4 (relating to academic standards and</u>
- 8 <u>assessment</u>).
- 9 "CTE concentrator" shall mean a student who, by the end of a
- 10 reporting year, will be reported as successfully completing at
- 11 least fifty percent (50%) of the minimum technical instructional
- 12 <u>hours required under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 339 (relating to vocational</u>
- 13 education).
- 14 "Department" shall mean the Department of Education of the
- 15 Commonwealth.
- 16 <u>"Keystone Exams" shall mean State-developed end-of-course</u>
- 17 exams. The term includes the designated Keystone Exams used to
- 18 <u>determine</u>, in part, a student's eligibility for high school
- 19 graduation.
- 20 "Program of study" shall mean instructional programs
- 21 developed by the department's Bureau of Career and Technical
- 22 Education that include content aligned with academic standards
- 23 and relevant career and technical content in a progression of
- 24 courses that align secondary education with postsecondary
- 25 <u>education to adequately prepare students to succeed in</u>
- 26 postsecondary education.
- 27 "School entity" shall mean a school district, charter school,
- 28 cyber charter school, area vocational technical school or
- 29 intermediate unit.
- 30 "Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of Education of the

- 1 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- 2 <u>"State assessment" shall mean a valid and reliable</u>
- 3 measurement of student performance on a set of academic
- 4 standards as measured by the Pennsylvania System of School
- 5 Assessment or the Keystone Exams.
- 6 "State board" shall mean the State Board of Education.
- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
