INTRODUCED BY MESSRS. IRVIS AND FINEMAN, JUNE 24, 1969

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS, JUNE 24, 1969

AN ACT

To provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970; and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969.

1 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA HEREBY
2 ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

3 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as "The General Appro-
4 priation Act of 1969."

5 Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are
6 hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named
7 agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth
8 for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the
9 duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for payment of
10 fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services,
11 printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as pro-
12 vided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions
13 and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning
14 July 1, 1969, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close
15 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969.

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1 To the Department of the Auditor General

2 For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper

3 conduct of the following purposes and activities:

4 Administration of the Department of the Auditor General, for audit-

5 ing requisitions by departments, boards or commissions, for disbursements out

6 of the General Fund and in auditing, annually, periodically or specially,

7 the affairs of any department, board or commission which are supported out

8 of the General Fund and for auditing justices of the peace, other fining

9 offices, Volunteer Firemen's Relief Association Funds and the offices of

10 elected State officials \$4,271,000 ;

11 In addition to this amount, all moneys received from any other source

12 as contributions to this program shall be paid into the General Fund and

13 credited to this appropriation.

14 Auditing appropriations for or relating to public assistance includ-

15 ing any Federal sums supplementing such appropriations 812,000 ;

16 Administration of the Board of Arbitration of Claims 86,000 ;

17 For payment of pensions to dependents of soldiers of the Penn-

18 sylvania National Guard killed in the line of duty 6,000 ;

19 To the Treasury Department

20 For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper

21 conduct of the following purposes and activities:

22 Administration of the Treasury Department 1,442,000

23 In addition to this amount, all moneys received from any other source

24 as contributions to this program, shall be paid into the General Fund and

25 credited to this appropriation.

26 Payment of the difference between the interest earned by the

27 moneys in the Agricultural College Land Scrip Fund and in the State

28 College Experimental Farm Fund and the interest guaranteed by the

29 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to Pennsylvania State University 15,000

 4 In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Govern-
 5 ment or from any other source as contributions for this program shall be
 6 paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation.
 7 Payment of compensation to owners of animals destroyed in disease
 8 eradication programs 73,000
 9 For the control of stem rust of wheat, oats, barley and rye by
 10 the eradication of rust-spreading barberry bushes, and providing for pay-
 11 ment thereof to counties making like expenditures of county funds 20,000
 12 The following sum, or as much thereof as may be necessary is
 13 hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to be paid into the State
 14 Farm Products Show Fund to pay for that portion of the Farm Show and
 15 maintenance to Farm Show Building that is not paid from Farm Show
 16 revenues as provided in section 1709 of The Administrative Code of
 17 1929 340,000
 18 Development and operation of an open livestock show, including
 19 cattle, swine, sheep and horses: Provided, That the department may
 20 make allocations of this appropriation as it deems appropriate to an
 21 incorporated association whose purposes are in accord with the purposes
 22 and intent of this appropriation; the funds so allocated to be used for
 23 the development and operation of a livestock show in Pennsylvania: And
 24 further provided, That the funds allocated by the department shall only
 25 be used for the specific items approved by the department in advance of
 26 the expenditure 50,000
 27 Planning and staging of an open dairy show: Provided, That the
 28 department makes allocations of this appropriation as it deems appropriate
 29 to an incorporated association whose purposes are in accord with the pur-
 30 poses and intent of this appropriation; the funds so allocated to be used

1 for the planning and staging of a dairy show in Pennsylvania: And, further
 2 provided, That the funds allocated by the department shall only be used
 3 for the specific items approved by the department in advance of the
 4 expenditure \$ 50,000
 5 Promotion and holding of annual local, regional and State
 6 4-H dairy clubs and Future Farmers of America dairy shows: Provided,
 7 That the department may make allocations of this appropriation as it
 8 deems appropriate to an association whose purposes are in accord with
 9 the purposes and intent of this appropriation, the funds so allocated to
 10 be used for the development and operation of Junior Dairy Shows: And,
 11 further provided, That the funds allocated by the department shall only
 12 be used for the specific items approved by the department in advance.... 15,000

 16 For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper
 17 administration of the Securities Commission 229,000

 19 For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper
 20 administration of the State Council of Civil Defense, including
 21 mobilization planning 359,000
 22 In addition, to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Govern-
 23 ment as contributions to this program shall be paid into the General Fund
 24 and credited to this appropriation.
 25 To the State Civil Service Commission
 26 For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper
 27 administration of the Civil Service Commission including administration
 28 of the merit system for employes under the provisions of the Civil Service
 29 Act supra: Provided, That in addition to the amount hereby appropriated,
 30 any money collected by the commission by the way of reimbursement under

1 the Civil Service Act shall be paid into the General Fund through
2 the Department of Revenue and shall be credited to this appropriation:
3 And, provided further, That the specific appropriation of one hundred
4 seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000) made hereby shall be used by
5 the commission as working capital only and shall lapse at the end of the
6 fiscal year in the full amount \$ 175,000

8 For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper
9 administration of the Department of Commerce, including the following:
10 industrial development administration, economic development, promotion

12 In addition to this amount all moneys received from the Federal Govern-
13 ment as contributions for this program shall be paid into the General
14 Fund and credited to this appropriation.

 14 Payment of rental charges to the General State Authority 60,000,000
 15 In addition to this amount certain moneys received from the State
 16 colleges and Indiana University of Pennsylvania, as student community
 17 building fees and additional dormitory rental fees, shall be paid into the
 18 General Fund and credited to this appropriation.
 19 To the Department of Public Instruction
 20 For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper
 21 administration of the Department of Public Instruction, including re-
 22 search and statistics, basic education, and higher education 7,093,000
 23 In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal
 24 Government, or from any other sources as contributions for this program,
 25 shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation.
 26 For the library services program which includes operation of the
 27 State library, providing reference services and administering of the aid
 28 to public libraries 750,000
 29 In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal

1 Government or from any other source as contributions for this program, shall
2 be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation.

3 Payment of rental charges to the General State Authority for capital
4 improvements at State-aided educational institutions \$4,810,000

5 In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the sublease of
6 projects to State-aided institutions shall be paid into the General Fund
7 and credited to this appropriation.

7 In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Govern-

12 And, in addition to the above amount, all income and all moneys collected
13 at the Thaddeus Stevens Trade School and paid into the General Fund of
14 the State Treasury under existing laws are hereby appropriated out of the
15 General Fund to the Thaddeus Stevens Trade School for the same purpose,
16 the school to receive from such appropriations the exact amount which was
17 collected at said school during the said fiscal period.

21 approval of the Governor, may make payments from this appropriation in

6 perties, equipment, facilities, files, records and accounts of any State

6 Section 3. This act is not intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal any

7 provision of any act enacted at this or any prior session of the General Assembly

8 regulating the purchase of supplies, the ordering of printing and binding, the pur-

9 chase, maintenance and use of automobiles, the method of making payments from

10 the State Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any administrative department,

11 board or commission.

12 Section 4. No appropriation made by this act to any department, board, com-

13 mission or agency of the Executive Department shall be available unless and until such

14 department, board commission or agency shall have complied with sections 604, 605

15 and 606 of The Administrative Code of 1929.

16 Section 5. The term "employees" as used in this act shall include all directors,

17 superintendents, bureau or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents,

18 assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants,

19 secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers,

20 bookkeepers, messengers, and other assistants in any department, board or commission.

21 Section 6. The term "expenses" and "maintenance" shall include all printing,

22 binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, traveling expenses,

23 training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,

24 telephone and telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, fuel,

25 light, heat, power and water, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and

26 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen's compensation,

27 insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, premiums on medical payment

28 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group life

29 insurance, and employee and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,

30 payment of Commonwealth share of social security taxes for State employees, the purchase

1 of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
2 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of Property and Supplies
3 of mileage charges for the use of automobiles and of expenses or costs of services
4 incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall include the
5 medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate
6 must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the
7 State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State
8 medical assistance program.

9 Section 7. Purchase of supplies, materials and equipment shall not be
10 deemed to be committed or encumbered until contracts covering said purchase
11 have been entered into with the vendors.

12 Section 8. In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, moneys received
13 in payment for food and household supplies furnished to employes and other persons,
14 except inmates by an institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale
15 of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other materials sold by the
16 department shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of
17 the General Fund to the several respective institutions for the operation and maintenance
18 of said institutions.

19 Further in addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received
20 from the Federal Government, or from any other source as contributions for the programs
21 provided herein, or as payment for services or materials furnished by one institution to
22 another, except those collections designated as revenues, shall be paid into the General
23 Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the
24 respective appropriations.

25 Section 9. That part of all appropriations in this act unexpended, uncommitted
26 and unencumbered as of June 30, 1970 shall automatically lapse as of that date.

27 Section 10. The provisions of this act shall be severable. If any provision of
28 this act is found by a court of record to be unconstitutional and void, the remaining
29 provisions of the act shall, nevertheless, remain valid unless the court finds the valid
30 provisions of the law are so essentially inseparably connected with and depend upon the

1 void provision that it cannot be presumed the General Assembly would have enacted
2 the remaining valid provisions without the void one, or unless the court finds the
3 remaining valid provisions standing alone are incompleted and are incapable of
4 being executed in accordance with the legislative intent.

5 Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.
