AN ACT

1 To provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and
2 Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and
3 for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1971 to
4 June 30, 1972, and for the payment of bills incurred and
5 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending
6 June 30, 1971.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as "The
10 General Appropriation Act of 1971."

11 Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be
12 necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General
13 Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive,
14 Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the
15 payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel
16 expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees
17 of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services
18 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services,
19 printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any
20 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for

1 the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and
2 for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year
3 beginning July 1, 1971, and for the payment of bills incurred
4 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending
5 June 30, 1971.

6 I. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

7 To the Governor

8 For the salaries, wages and all necessary
9 expenses for the following purposes and activities,
10 including the maintenance of the executive mansion,
11 the expense of entertainment of official guests and
12 members of the General Assembly and the Judiciary,
13 participation in the Governor's Conference, the
14 expenses of the Executive Board, and for the
15 payment of traveling expenses of persons other
16 than employees of the Commonwealth appointed by
17 the Governor to represent or otherwise serve the
18 Commonwealth.

 4 Civil Service Act shall be paid into the
 5 General Fund and credited to this appropriation.

8 For the salaries, wages and all necessary
 9 expenses for the proper administration of
 10 the Human Relations Commission program..... 1,289,000

11 In addition to this amount, all moneys
 12 received from the Federal Government or from
 13 any other source as contributions for this
 14 program shall be paid into the General
 15 Fund and credited to this appropriation.

 19 expenses for the proper administration of the

 22 For the salaries, wages and all necessary

 24 State Council of Civil Defense, including
 25 mobilization planning..... 347,000
 26 In addition to this amount, all moneys
 27 received from the Federal Government as con-
 28 tributions to this program shall be paid into
 29 the General Fund and credited to this
 30 appropriation.

1 To the Department of Commerce
 2 For the salaries, wages and all necessary
 3 expenses for the proper administration of the
 4 Department of Commerce, including the following:
 5 industrial development, economic development,
 6 travel development, business services and
 7 statistics..... 3,015,000
 8 In addition to this amount all moneys received
 9 from the Federal Government or from any other
 10 source as contributions for this program
 11 shall be paid into the General Fund and
 12 credited to this appropriation.
 13 For the payment of grants to recognized
 14 industrial development agencies to assist such
 15 agencies in the financing of their operational
 16 costs for the purposes of making studies,
 17 surveys and investigations, the compilation of
 18 data and statistics and in the carrying out of
 19 planning and promotional programs..... 400,000
 20 For industrial construction loans through
 21 the Pennsylvania Industrial Development
 22 Authority..... 10,000,000
 23 For the purposes set forth in the act of
 24 May 6, 1968 (Act No. 61), known as the "Site
 25 Development Act"..... 800,000
 26 For the Governor's Science Advisory Com-
 27 mittee to finance research and information
 28 dissemination projects to be conducted by
 29 the Pennsylvania State University for the bene-
 30 fit of Pennsylvania industry to insure more

1	jobs for Pennsylvania.....	100,000
2	For the payment of grants to Appalachian	
3	Local Development Districts.....	50,000
4	In addition to this amount, all moneys received

20	For the Pennsylvania Science and Engineering	
21	Foundation to promote, stimulate, and encourage	
22	basic and applied scientific research and	
23	development and scientific and technological

28	For the salaries, wages and all necessary

5 ceived from the Federal Government as contri-
6 butions for this program shall be paid into the

8 For the payment of housing assistance grants
9 in accordance with section 4(d) and (e) of the
10 act of May 20, 1949 (P.L.1633)..... 3,000,000

11 For planning and administration of a State-
12 wide manpower employment assistance and train-
13 ing program..... 2,000,000

14 For payments of grants to community action
15 agencies as provided by the act of January

19 assist in developing and implementing coopera-

25 For the salaries, wages and all necessary
26 expenses for the proper administration of the

1 received from the Federal Government, or from
2 any other source as contributions for this
3 program shall be paid into the General Fund
4 and credited to this appropriation.

5 For the operation of the State library,
6 providing reference services and adminis-
7 tering aid to public libraries..... 908,000

8 In addition to this amount, all moneys
9 received from the Federal Government, or from
10 any other source as contributions for this
11 program shall be paid into the General Fund
12 and credited to this appropriation.

13 Payment of rental charges to The General
14 State Authority for capital improvements at
15 State-aided educational institutions..... 5,385,000

16 In addition to this amount, all moneys
17 received from the sublease of projects to
18 State-aided institutions shall be paid into the
19 General Fund and credited to this appropriation.

20 Operation, maintenance and administration
21 of the State colleges and State-owned
22 university..... 83,332,000

23 And in addition to the above amount, all income
24 and all moneys not subject to refund collected
25 at the several State colleges and Indiana
26 University or received from the Federal Govern-
27 ment or from any other source and paid into
28 the General Fund of the State Treasury under
29 existing laws are hereby appropriated out of
30 the General Fund to the several State colleges

1 and Indiana University for the same purpose,
2 each college and university to receive from
3 such appropriation the exact amount which was
4 collected at said college or university or re-
5 ceived from the Federal Government or from any
6 other source during the said fiscal period.

1 shall be paid into the General Fund and
 2 credited to this appropriation.

3 To provide aid to the Free Library of
 4 Philadelphia and the Carnegie Library of
 5 Pittsburgh, to meet the costs incurred in serv-
 6 ing as regional libraries in the distribution of
 7 blind reading materials and talking book
 8 machines..... 542,000

9 To provide grants to school districts to
 10 assist in meeting the matching requirements
 11 of Federal grants received under Federal
 12 programs for the education of the dis-
 13 advantaged where such programs meet criteria
 14 established by the Department of Education..... 1,000,000

15 For annual payments not to exceed five
 16 hundred dollars per student to institutions
 17 of higher learning for defraying the expenses
 18 of deaf or blind students..... 35,000

19 For payments to schools for the deaf, blind
 20 and cerebral palsied..... 21,800,000

21 For payment of the Commonwealth's share
 22 of the approved operating costs and lease
 23 payments of intermediate units..... 5,290,000

24 For payment into the Social Security
 25 Contribution Fund the Commonwealth's share
 26 of Federal Social Security taxes for public

28 For payment of required contribution
 29 into the Contingent Reserve and Supplemental

4 To the Department of Environmental Resources
5 For the salaries, wages and all necessary
6 expenses for the proper administration of the
7 Department of Environmental Resources including
8 water resources, land and forest resources, State
9 parks, environmental protection and mines..... 36,813,000

10 In addition to this amount, all moneys re-
11 ceived from the Federal Government or from
12 any other source as contributions for these
13 programs shall be paid into the General Fund
14 and credited to this appropriation.

15 For the payment of the cost of manpower,
16 equipment and materials used in the control
17 and extinction of forest fires..... 100,000

18 In addition to this amount, all moneys re-
19 ceived from the Federal Government or from any
20 other source as contributions for this program
21 shall be paid into the General Fund and credited
22 to this appropriation.

23 For the support of the Susquehanna River
24 Basin Commission, requisitions to be signed by
25 the Secretary of Environmental Resources..... 75,000

15 Section 3. This act is not intended to be inconsistent with
 16 or to repeal any provision of any act enacted at this or any
 17 prior session of the General Assembly regulating the purchase of
 18 supplies, the ordering of printing and binding, the purchase,
 19 maintenance and use of automobiles, the method of making
 20 payments from the State Treasury for any purpose or the
 21 functioning of any administrative department, board or
 22 commission.

23 Section 4. No appropriation made by this act to any
 24 department, board, commission or agency of the Executive
 25 Department shall be available unless and until such department,
 26 board, commission or agency shall have complied with sections
 27 604, 605, and 606 of "The Administrative Code of 1929."

28 Section 5. The term "employees" as used in this act shall
 29 include all directors, superintendents, bureau or division
 30 chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents,

1 assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors,
2 draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors,
3 examiners, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers,
4 bookkeepers, messengers and other assistants in any department,
5 board or commission.

6 Section 6. The term "expenses" and "maintenance" shall
7 include all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage,
8 materials and supplies, traveling expenses, training, motor
9 vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express, and cartage,
10 postage, telephones and telegraph rentals and toll charges,
11 newspaper advertising and notices, fuel, light, heat, power and
12 water, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and
13 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on
14 workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
15 liability insurance, premiums on medical payment insurance and
16 surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employee group
17 life insurance, and employee and retired employee group hospital
18 and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth share of social
19 security taxes for State employees, the purchase of replacement
20 or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
21 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of
22 Property and Supplies of mileage and other charges for the use
23 of automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred
24 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall
25 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State
26 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside
27 hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution
28 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State
29 medical assistance program.

30 Section 7. Purchase of supplies, materials and equipment

1 shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered until
2 contracts covering said purchase have been entered into with the
3 vendors.

4 Section 8. In addition to the amounts appropriated by this
5 act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies
6 furnished to employes and other persons, except inmates by an
7 institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale
8 of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber, or other
9 materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General
10 Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the
11 several respective institutions for the operation and
12 maintenance of said institutions.

13 Further, in addition to the amounts appropriated by this act,
14 all moneys received from the Federal Government, or from any
15 other source as contributions for the programs provided herein,
16 or as payment for services or materials furnished by one
17 institution to another, except those collections designated as
18 revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund and hereby
19 appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the
20 respective appropriations.

21 Section 9. That part of all appropriations in this act
22 unexpended, uncommitted and unencumbered as of June 30, 1972,
23 shall automatically lapse as of that date.

24 Section 10. The provisions of this act shall be severable.
25 If any provision of this act is found by a court of record to be
26 unconstitutional and void, the remaining provisions of the act
27 shall nevertheless, remain valid unless the court finds the
28 valid provisions of the law are so essentially inseparable
29 connected with and depend upon the void provision that it cannot
30 be presumed the General Assembly would have enacted the

1 remaining valid provisions without the void one, or unless the
2 court finds the remaining valid provisions standing alone are
3 incompleted and are incapable of being executed in accordance
4 with the legislative intent.

5 Section 11. This act shall take effect immediately.
