AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Providing for the establishment of the Commonwealth Productivity Council; prescribing its powers and duties to investigate, examine and make recommendations to improve governmental productivity by the Commonwealth; and making an appropriation.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Short TitleThis act shall be known and may be
9	cited as the "Commonwealth Productivity Council Act."
10	Section 2. Declaration of PurposeIt is the intention of
11	the General Assembly to provide means for improving the quality
12	and quantity of governmental services rendered to the citizens
13	of this Commonwealth. Such improvements in productivity are
14	especially necessary in regard to: (i) the use of innovative
15	techniques in the utilization of capital and labor; (ii) the use
16	of modern technology in service utilization; and (iii) the use
17	of modern management techniques of systems analysis, planning
18	and evaluation, etc. In order to provide expertise for the
19	research and investigation necessary to such an endeavor, it is

appropriate that a Commonwealth Productivity Council be
 established to study and make recommendations to the Governor
 and to the General Assembly on methods, approaches, and
 alternatives to improve governmental productivity and to oversee
 the activities of the executive branch in these areas.

6 Section 3. Commonwealth Productivity Council. -- There is 7 hereby established an independent advisory council to be known 8 as the Commonwealth Productivity Council, which shall consist of 16 members. The members of the council shall be: the Secretary 9 10 of Administration, who shall serve as chairman of the council; 11 the Secretary of Commerce; the Secretary of Labor and Industry; the Secretary of Budget; the Governor's Science Advisor; four 12 13 members appointed by the Governor; one of whom shall be a 14 representative of business management; one of whom shall be a 15 representative of Pennsylvania's labor organizations; one of 16 whom shall be a Commonwealth employee; and one of whom shall be 17 a representative of the consuming public; three members 18 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; at 19 least two of whom shall be members of the House, providing 20 representation of both political parties; three members 21 appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate; at least 22 two of whom shall be members of the Senate, providing representation of both political parties; and one member 23 24 designated by the Local Government Conference as its 25 representative. Members of the council shall be encouraged to 26 make available their staff to assist the council in the conduct 27 of its activities.

28 Section 4. Powers and Duties of Council.--The council shall 29 have the power and its duty shall be to:

30 (1) Examine the Commonwealth's procedures and systems to 19750H0220B0243 - 2 - measure and develop standards for unit costs, deployment of
 State resources in service effectiveness evaluations and make
 recommendations to improve such activities so as to complement
 productivity improvements mentioned below.

5 (2) Examine the feasibility of applying productivity 6 incentive pay systems to the State Government and consider other 7 productivity improvements in the realm of labor-management 8 relations.

9 (3) Examine methods and approaches to improve worker
10 satisfaction in State Government through recognition,
11 participation, rotation, and other behavioral incentives.
12 (4) Examine ways to apply improved management and systems
13 approaches to the operations of State Government to increase
14 productivity.

15 (5) Examine existing State systems for monitoring and 16 performance assessment of service delivery to increase 17 productivity.

18 (6) Examine the feasibility of creating a "productivity19 bank" for the State Capital Budget.

(7) Examine State tax policies, financial incentives,
program requirements, and planning and administrative systems
now being utilized and make recommendations for changes so as to
increase outputs.

(8) Examine and propose better methods for the State to
carry out its productivity improvement program including
measurements, output classifications, etc.

(9) Examine the State's procurement practices to determine where the Commonwealth could best apply and support new technological applications that would increase productivity.

30 (10) Examine and make recommendations for changes in State 19750H0220B0243 - 3 - 1 civil service laws that retard productivity improvements.

2 (11) Make recommendations for components of an overall3 Commonwealth productivity policy.

4 (12) Suggest a model law for productivity bargaining in the5 governmental sector.

Examine any other areas of interest pertaining to the 6 (13)improvement of State and local government productivity. 7 8 Section 5. Staff and Activities of Council. -- The council shall carry out its duties and responsibilities through the 9 10 hiring of professional staff and assistance, including 11 consultants, and may hold conferences, conduct seminars, formulate model programs, furnish assistance, and carry out any 12 13 other activities relating to the council's duties and responsibilities delineated in section 4 of this act. 14

Section 6. Reports.--The council may issue interim reports including a plan of action for increasing the productivity of the government in the Commonwealth.

Section 7. Program Review and Information to General Assembly.--The council shall, among its other duties, review and advise the General Assembly on the effectiveness and success of the Governor's productivity improvement program and shall conduct an ongoing quality control and verification process either directly or by contract of the Governor's productivity improvement program.

25 Section 8. Appropriation.--The sum of \$300,000 is 26 specifically appropriated to the Commonwealth Productivity 27 Council to carry out the purposes of this act. 28 Section 9. Effective Date.--This act shall take effect

29 immediately.
