AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and 2 3 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and 4 changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 6 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 8 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 12 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 13 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 15 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 16 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," 17 authorizing the acceptance of credit cards by State stores 18 and further providing for acceptance of checks. - 20 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 305, act of April 12, 21
- 22 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the "Liquor Code," amended
- October 2, 1974 (No.222), is amended to read: 23
- Sales by Pennsylvania Liquor Stores. --* * * 24 Section 305.
- 25 (b) Every Pennsylvania Liquor Store shall sell liquors at
- wholesale to hotels, restaurants, clubs, and railroad, pullman 26

- 1 and steamship companies licensed under this act; and, under the
- 2 regulations of the board, to pharmacists duly licensed and
- 3 registered under the laws of the Commonwealth, and to
- 4 manufacturing pharmacists, and to reputable hospitals approved
- 5 by the board, or chemists. The board may sell to registered
- 6 pharmacists only such liquors as conform to the Pharmacopoeia of
- 7 the United States, the National Formulary, or the American
- 8 Homeopathic Pharmacopeia. The board may sell at special prices
- 9 under the regulations of the board, to United States Armed
- 10 Forces facilities which are located on United States Armed
- 11 Forces installations and are conducted pursuant to the authority
- 12 and regulations of the United States Armed Forces. All other
- 13 sales by such stores shall be at retail. [No liquor] <u>Liquor</u>
- 14 shall be sold [except] for cash, [except that] but the board
- 15 may, by regulation, authorize the acceptance of checks or credit
- 16 cards for liquor sold either at wholesale or retail. The board
- 17 shall have power to designate certain stores for wholesale or
- 18 retail sales exclusively.
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
