## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, relating to false alarms to agencies
- 3 of public safety.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 4905 of Title 18, act of November 25,
- 7 1970 (P.L.707, No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes, added December 6, 1972 (P.L.1482, No.334), is amended
- 9 to read:
- 10 § 4905. False alarms to agencies of public safety.
- 11 A person who knowingly causes a false alarm of fire or other
- 12 emergency to be transmitted to or within any organization,
- 13 official or volunteer, for dealing with emergencies involving
- 14 danger to life or property commits a misdemeanor of the first
- 15 degree. Such person commits a felony of the third degree if a
- 16 false alarm of fire or other emergency knowingly transmitted by
- 17 him results in an accident, injury to any person, damage to any

- 1 property, fatality, or any other loss, if the organization in
- 2 the act of responding to the false alarm is called upon to
- 3 respond to another fire or emergency whether real or false, or
- 4 <u>if a false alarm of fire or other emergency is transmitted to or</u>
- 5 <u>within more than one such organization concurrently.</u> TRANSMITTED <-
- 6 BY HIM:
- 7 (1) RESULTS IN AN ACCIDENT, INJURY TO ANY PERSON, DAMAGE
- 8 TO ANY PROPERTY, FATALITY, OR ANY OTHER LOSS.
- 9 (2) IF THE ORGANIZATION IN THE ACT OF RESPONDING TO THE
- 10 FALSE ALARM IS CALLED UPON TO RESPOND TO ANOTHER FIRE OR
- 11 EMERGENCY WHETHER REAL OR FALSE.
- 12 (3) A FALSE ALARM OF FIRE OR OTHER EMERGENCY IS
- 13 TRANSMITTED TO OR WITHIN MORE THAN ONE SUCH ORGANIZATION
- 14 CONCURRENTLY.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
