## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- 2 act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- 3 welfare laws of the Commonwealth, " adding Older
- 4 Pennsylvanians' provisions establishing State and local
- 5 agencies to assist older persons and defining
- 6 responsibilities.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 SECTION 1. SECTION 316, ACT OF JUNE 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
- 10 NO.21), KNOWN AS THE "PUBLIC WELFARE CODE," IS AMENDED TO READ:
- 11 SECTION 316. BOARDS OF TRUSTEES OF GENERAL HOSPITALS; POWERS
- 12 AND DUTIES; SUPERVISION. -- (A) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF EACH OF
- 13 THE STATE GENERAL HOSPITALS SHALL HAVE GENERAL DIRECTION AND
- 14 CONTROL OF THE PROPERTY AND MANAGEMENT OF SUCH INSTITUTION. IT
- 15 SHALL HAVE THE POWER, AND ITS DUTY SHALL BE:
- 16 (1) SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR, TO ELECT A
- 17 SUPERINTENDENT OF THE HOSPITAL, WHO SHALL, SUBJECT TO THE
- 18 AUTHORITY OF THE BOARD, ADMINISTER THE INSTITUTION IN ALL ITS

- 1 DEPARTMENTS;
- 2 (2) ON NOMINATION BY THE SUPERINTENDENT FROM TIME TO TIME,
- 3 TO APPOINT SUCH OFFICERS AND EMPLOYES AS MAY BE NECESSARY;
- 4 (3) TO FIX THE SALARIES OF ITS EMPLOYES IN CONFORMITY WITH
- 5 THE STANDARDS ESTABLISHED BY THE EXECUTIVE BOARD;
- 6 (4) SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE SECRETARY, TO MAKE SUCH
- 7 BYLAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE
- 8 INSTITUTION AS IT MAY DEEM WISE.
- 9 (5) WHEN ONLY A PART OF A HOSPITAL IS USED AS A GERIATRIC
- 10 CENTER, THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF SUCH
- 11 HOSPITAL SHALL CONTINUE TO EXTEND TO THE ENTIRE INSTITUTION.
- 12 (B) FISCAL, FINANCIAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE CONTROL SHALL BE
- 13 <u>VESTED IN THE DIRECTOR OF STATE GENERAL HOSPITALS IN HARRISBURG.</u>
- 14 SECTION 1. 2. ARTICLE VI, ACT OF JUNE 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
- 15 NO.21), KNOWN AS THE "PUBLIC WELFARE CODE," OF THE ACT is <--

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- 16 amended to read:
- 17 ARTICLE VI
- 18 [THE AGED]
- 19 OLDER PENNSYLVANIANS ACT
- 20 [Section 601. Annual Grants; Aid for Community Living. -- The
- 21 department shall have the power to enter into agreements with
- 22 county commissioners to make annual grants to defray part of the
- 23 cost of care and services designed to help dependents and
- 24 potential dependents to live outside of county institutions. The
- 25 amount of each such annual grant shall be calculated in
- 26 accordance with a formula to be established by the department.]
- 27 Section 601.1. Purpose. -- In keeping with the objectives of
- 28 the Older Americans Act of 1965 (Pub.L.89-73, as amended), to
- 29 <u>entitle older persons to the opportunity for adequate retirement</u>
- 30 income, the best possible physical and mental health, suitable

- 1 housing, restorative services for the institutionalized, freedom
- 2 from age discrimination in employment, and retirement in health,
- 3 honor and dignity, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall
- 4 establish State and local agencies for the advancement of these
- 5 objectives and shall assist these efforts with State funds and
- 6 the proper use of available private and other public funds.
- 7 Section 602. Definitions.--As used in this article, the
- 8 <u>following definitions apply:</u>
- 9 <u>"Advisory committee" means the Advisory Committee for the</u>
- 10 Aging as established by the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
- 11 No.75), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929."
- 12 <u>"Area agency" means the single local agency designated within</u>
- 13 each planning and service area to administer the delivery of a
- 14 comprehensive and coordinated system of social services.
- 15 <u>"Area plan" means the plan submitted to the deputy secretary</u>
- 16 by an area agency describing the methods by which it will ensure
- 17 <u>a coordinated and comprehensive system of social services in the</u>
- 18 planning and service area.
- 19 "Commissioner" means the Regional Commissioner for the Aging
- 20 <u>serving in each of the regional offices of the Department of</u>
- 21 Public Welfare and responsible directly to the Deputy Secretary
- 22 for the Aging.
- 23 "Consumer" means an individual who participates or is
- 24 <u>eligible to participate in aging programs provided pursuant to</u>
- 25 the Older Americans Act and other aging programs.
- 26 <u>"Department" means the Department of Public Welfare.</u>
- 27 "Deputy secretary" means the Deputy Secretary for the Aging
- 28 in the Department of Public Welfare who is responsible directly
- 29 to the secretary.
- 30 "Fiscal year" means the fiscal year of the local authority.

- 1 "Local authority" means the county commissioners.
- 2 <u>"Office" means the Office for the Aging.</u>
- 3 <u>"Older persons" means those persons residing within</u>
- 4 Pennsylvania who are age sixty or over.
- 5 <u>"Planning and service area" means the geographic unit within</u>
- 6 the State, as authorized by the Older Americans Act, as amended,
- 7 for allocation of funds for the delivery of social services.
- 8 <u>"Secretary" means the Secretary of Public Welfare.</u>
- 9 <u>Section 603. Deputy Secretary for the Aging.--(a) The</u>
- 10 secretary shall appoint a Deputy Secretary for the Aging. The
- 11 office of the deputy shall be the single organizational unit
- 12 within the department. It shall have delegated authority for,
- 13 and its principal responsibilities shall be, Statewide planning,
- 14 coordination, administration, and evaluation of programs and
- 15 activities related to the purposes of the Older Americans Act.
- 16 The Deputy Secretary for the Aging, with the approval of the
- 17 secretary, shall develop plans and programs and make
- 18 recommendations with respect to the Commonwealth's aging
- 19 programs. He shall initiate, develop, and with the approval of
- 20 the secretary help carry into effect plans and programs for
- 21 services for older persons. The Deputy Secretary for the Aging
- 22 shall provide information and technical assistance to and
- 23 consider the advice given by the advisory committee.
- 24 (b) The deputy secretary, with the approval of the
- 25 <u>secretary</u>, <u>shall establish planning and service areas</u>, <u>and shall</u>
- 26 upon the submission of an acceptable plan by the local
- 27 authority, approve the designation of the area agency pursuant
- 28 to section 608.
- 29 <u>(c) The deputy secretary shall serve as advisor to the</u>
- 30 secretary in all matters affecting the interest of older

- 1 persons. In addition, the Deputy Secretary on Aging shall, with
- 2 the approval of the secretary, have the power and his duty shall
- 3 be to:
- 4 (1) Direct, supervise and evaluate the activities of the
- 5 regional aging commissioners and area agencies on aging.
- 6 (2) Promulgate and revise, as necessary, regulations
- 7 requisite to the operation of the office.
- 8 (3) Consider the advice and recommendations of older persons
- 9 <u>in carrying out his responsibilities under this act.</u>
- 10 (4) Maintain a clearinghouse of information related to the
- 11 <u>interests of older persons.</u>
- 12 <u>(5) Determine the needs of older persons and represent their</u>
- 13 interests at all levels of government and within the community
- 14 at large.
- 15 (6) Stimulate more effective use of existing resources and
- 16 <u>services for older persons and develop programs, opportunities</u>
- 17 and services which are not otherwise provided for older persons.
- 18 (7) Provide technical assistance and consultation to all
- 19 agencies, both public and private, with respect to programs and
- 20 <u>services for older persons.</u>
- 21 (8) To develop, in cooperation with the advisory committee,
- 22 a basic policy for State programs and activities for older
- 23 persons.
- 24 (9) Develop and conduct, in coordination with other
- 25 agencies, research, demonstration programs and training programs
- 26 to advance the interests of older persons.
- 27 (10) Publish a description of the organization and functions
- 28 of the office so that all interested agencies and individuals
- 29 may receive information and be better able to solicit assistance
- 30 from the office.

- 1 (11) Make recommendations for legislative action to the
- 2 <u>secretary</u>, the Governor and the General Assembly.
- 3 (12) The deputy secretary may pursuant to section 601.1,
- 4 appoint or designate advisory committees and citizens task force
- 5 to provide advice and counsel with respect to programs for the
- 6 aging administered by the office.
- 7 <u>Section 604</u>. Evaluation, Research and Demonstration. -- (a)
- 8 The deputy secretary shall continually review and evaluate the
- 9 activities of area agencies and the impact and effectiveness of
- 10 all programs under this act. The deputy secretary shall seek the
- 11 views of the advisory committee and the advisory boards of area
- 12 agencies in developing appropriate criteria for evaluations. The
- 13 deputy secretary shall ensure that evaluations, including an
- 14 onsite evaluation, be made annually of all area agency
- 15 <u>activities and programs</u>. A written report of the findings of the
- 16 evaluation shall be submitted to the area agency subject to the
- 17 evaluation and within thirty days shall be available to the
- 18 public. In all evaluations, the deputy secretary shall obtain
- 19 the views of program beneficiaries concerning strengths and
- 20 <u>weaknesses of the program. Other departments and agencies of the</u>
- 21 Commonwealth shall make available to the deputy secretary
- 22 information necessary for such evaluations. All studies,
- 23 evaluations, proposals, and data produced or developed by the
- 24 agency shall become the property of the Commonwealth and be
- 25 <u>available to the public. A portion of all funds appropriated for</u>
- 26 aging programs shall be used for evaluations required or
- 27 authorized by this section. Annually the department shall submit
- 28 to the Governor and the General Assembly a report on the
- 29 <u>activities of the office and area agencies on aging, including</u>
- 30 statistical data reflecting services and activities provided

- 1 <u>older persons during the preceding fiscal year.</u>
- 2 (b) In recognition of the need for expanded knowledge and
- 3 <u>experience concerning the status of older persons in</u>
- 4 Pennsylvania, the deputy secretary shall be responsible, subject
- 5 to the approval of the secretary, for providing for research and
- 6 <u>demonstration programs for the purpose of:</u>
- 7 (1) Studying current living conditions and needs of older
- 8 persons, with special emphasis on persons with low income,
- 9 <u>functional disabilities</u>, <u>advanced age and isolated living</u>
- 10 <u>situations</u>.
- 11 (2) Studying existing methods and alternatives for providing
- 12 <u>services</u>, <u>programs</u> and <u>opportunities</u> to older <u>persons</u>.
- 13 (3) Identifying those factors of particular detriment or
- 14 benefit to the welfare of older persons.
- 15 (4) Developing new approaches and alternatives for living
- 16 <u>arrangements</u>, <u>social services</u>, <u>institutional care</u>, <u>health</u>
- 17 services, legal representation and the coordination of community
- 18 services for older persons.
- 19 <u>Section 605. Education and Training. -- The deputy secretary,</u>
- 20 with the advice of the advisory committee and subject to the
- 21 approval of the secretary, shall develop and make provision for
- 22 programs of education and training for and about older persons,
- 23 and increase opportunities for employment and community services
- 24 for older persons.
- 25 <u>Section 606. Deputy Secretary's Comment on Proposed</u>
- 26 <u>Commonwealth Policies.--The deputy secretary shall review all</u>
- 27 proposed Commonwealth program plans and policies, and
- 28 <u>administrative regulations that are published in the</u>
- 29 <u>Pennsylvania Bulletin for their impact on older persons. Where</u>
- 30 the deputy secretary believes that they will have an impact on

- 1 older persons, he shall comment in accordance with the
- 2 provisions of the Commonwealth Documents Law. Any comment
- 3 indicating disapproval of all or part of the proposed
- 4 <u>administrative regulations must be specifically considered by</u>
- 5 the agency and commented on by the agency if it adopts the
- 6 provisions to which the deputy secretary objected in its order
- 7 <u>adopting the regulations.</u>
- 8 Section 607. Planning and Service Area. -- The Commonwealth
- 9 shall be divided into district planning and service areas
- 10 contiquous with the boundaries established pursuant to the
- 11 provisions of the act of October 20, 1966 (P.L.96, No.6), known
- 12 as the "Mental Health and Mental Retardation Act of 1966,"
- 13 unless the secretary, after consultation with the deputy
- 14 secretary agrees to the recommendations of local authorities for
- 15 <u>a different geographical boundary. In considering whether or not</u>
- 16 a different geographical boundary should be employed, the
- 17 secretary must consider:
- 18 (1) Boundaries drawn and planned for administration and
- 19 planning of social service programs.
- 20 (2) Boundaries for county government.
- 21 (3) The geographical distribution of persons sixty years of
- 22 <u>age or</u> older.
- 23 (4) The needs of older persons for social service with
- 24 special attention to the needs of low income and minority.
- 25 (5) The distribution of resources available to provide
- 26 <u>social services</u>.
- 27 Section 608. Designated Area Agencies. -- (a) For each
- 28 planning and service area there shall be an area agency
- 29 <u>established by the same local authority as that providing mental</u>
- 30 <u>health and mental retardation services unless the secretary,</u>

- 1 after consultation with the deputy secretary, agrees to a
- 2 request by local authorities for delivery of aging services by
- 3 an entity other than the local authority.
- 4 (b) An area agency so designated must be:
- 5 (1) an established office of aging; or
- 6 (2) any office or agency of the local authority, which is
- 7 designated for this purpose by the chief elected officials of
- 8 the local authority; or
- 9 (3) any office or agency designated by the chief elected
- 10 officials of a combination of local authorities to act on behalf
- 11 of such combination for this purpose,
- 12 and must provide assurance, found adequate by the department,
- 13 that it will have the ability to develop and administer an area
- 14 plan. Where a nonpublic agency is already serving as an area
- 15 agency for the aging, a local authority may not act as a
- 16 <u>designated area agency for the aging without the prior express</u>
- 17 written consent of the secretary. The approval granted by the
- 18 secretary pursuant to this section may be revoked by the
- 19 secretary by written notice furnished the local authority one
- 20 hundred days prior to the beginning of the fiscal year of the
- 21 local authority.
- 22 Section 609. Area Agencies; Powers and Duties.--(a) The area
- 23 agency shall have the authority to act as an advocate at all
- 24 levels of government and within the community at large for the
- 25 <u>interests of older persons within the planning and service area.</u>
- 26 It shall develop a comprehensive and coordinated system of
- 27 services for older persons within its planning and service area
- 28 as the department may prescribe by regulation. The plan must
- 29 <u>make provision for:</u>
- 30 (1) Information and referral.

- 1 (2) Social service case management and casework services
- 2 <u>including protective placement and services.</u>
- 3 (3) Transportation services.
- 4 (4) Legal counseling and representation.
- 5 (5) In-home services including homemaker, home chore
- 6 <u>services</u>, and congregate and home delivered meals.
- 7 (6) Assistance to secure adequate housing and health
- 8 <u>services</u>.
- 9 (b) The area agency shall provide for the establishment of
- 10 an affiliated network of multi-service centers and neighborhood
- 11 <u>centers for older persons. Each center shall provide those</u>
- 12 <u>services required by the department in accordance with</u>
- 13 <u>regulations adopted by the department.</u>
- 14 (c) The area agency shall give priority of services to older
- 15 persons with the greatest needs and least resources. Factors
- 16 <u>identifying older persons who are entitled to priority are:</u>
- 17 (1) Functional disability, i.e., severe restriction of
- 18 ability to carry out daily activities.
- 19 (2) Aloneness, i.e., living alone in a private apartment or
- 20 <u>home unaccompanied by a related adult.</u>
- 21 (3) Advanced age, i.e., seventy-five years of age or above.
- (4) Low income.
- 23 (5) Services to minorities in proportion to their numbers
- 24 consistent with the provisions of the Human Relations Act.
- 25 (d) In carrying out this section, the area agency shall
- 26 establish a merit personnel system in accordance with
- 27 regulations promulgated by the department which shall include
- 28 all area agency personnel and the employment generated through
- 29 area agency subcontracts. Such regulations shall stipulate that
- 30 <u>any merit system adopted by area agencies and all agreements</u>

- 1 with subcontractors shall provide for preferential employment
- 2 for persons aged sixty or over, including provision for the
- 3 <u>substitution of experience and skills for educational and</u>
- 4 professional qualifications.
- 5 (e) The area agency may be authorized by the deputy
- 6 secretary to grant to or contract with any public, or nonprofit
- 7 or other private agency for the provision of social services.
- 8 The area agency is authorized to use, with their consent, the
- 9 <u>services</u>, <u>equipment</u>, <u>personnel</u> and <u>facilities</u> of <u>Federal</u> and
- 10 State agencies, with or without reimbursement, and on a similar
- 11 basis to cooperate with other public and private agencies, and
- 12 <u>instrumentalities</u>, in the use of services, equipment and
- 13 facilities.
- 14 Section 610. Area Agency Advisory Boards. -- (a) In each
- 15 planning and service area, the local authorities shall appoint
- 16 <u>an advisory board of at least fifteen members to the area</u>
- 17 agency. The advisory board shall consist of:
- 18 (1) A majority of older persons, including an appropriate
- 19 representation of low income and minority older persons.
- 20 (2) Representatives of public and private agencies serving
- 21 older persons.
- 22 (3) Members of the general public who are concerned with the
- 23 needs and interests of older persons.
- 24 (b) One-third of members shall be appointed for three-year
- 25 terms; one-third shall be appointed for two-year terms; one-
- 26 third shall be appointed for one-year terms. All subsequent
- 27 appointments shall be for terms of three years.
- 28 (c) Prior to making such appointments the chief elected
- 29 <u>officials of the local authority will appoint a nominating panel</u>
- 30 of five persons who will be representatives of the general

- 1 public including older persons. It will be the function of the
- 2 panel to nominate no fewer than two persons for each existing
- 3 vacancy on the advisory board. The chief elected officials of
- 4 the local authority will appoint advisory board members only
- 5 from the list of nominees submitted by the panel.
- 6 Section 611. Area Agency Advisory Board; Powers and
- 7 Duties. -- (a) The area agency advisory board shall have the power
- 8 and its duty shall be:
- 9 (1) To hold public hearings on the needs and problems of
- 10 <u>older persons</u>.
- 11 (2) To review and evaluate the area agency's aging needs,
- 12 <u>services</u>, <u>facilities</u> and <u>special problems</u> in <u>relation</u> to the
- 13 <u>local health and social service needs and programs.</u>
- 14 (3) Upon the occurrence of a vacancy, to recommend to local
- 15 <u>authorities not less than two persons for the position of</u>
- 16 <u>administrator</u>. Such persons shall meet the standards of
- 17 professional skills and experience as the department may
- 18 establish by regulation. The local authority may delegate to the
- 19 advisory board the power to appoint the administrator.
- 20 (4) To assist the administrator in the development of the
- 21 area plan, to hold public hearings on the plan, approve the area
- 22 plan, and upon approval submit comments on the plan to the
- 23 department in accordance with regulations established by the
- 24 <u>department</u>.
- 25 (5) To make recommendations regarding the program and any
- 26 other matters relating to services for the aging in the planning
- 27 and service area.
- 28 (6) To act as an advocate and ombudsman for older persons,
- 29 <u>establishing and maintaining a procedure for hearing personal</u>
- 30 complaints and grievances with respect to denial of services or

- 1 maltreatment.
- 2 (7) Area agency administrative funds shall be made available
- 3 by the area agency to implement this section.
- 4 <u>Section 612. Area Agencies; Reports and Plans.--(a) The area</u>
- 5 agency shall submit to the department through the Office for the
- 6 Aging an annual report describing and evaluating its programs
- 7 and services within thirty days after the close of the fiscal
- 8 year.
- 9 (b) The area agency shall submit to the department through
- 10 the Office for the Aging for approval an area plan ninety days
- 11 prior to the start of each fiscal year. If the department
- 12 through the Office for the Aging approves the area plan, or
- 13 fails to act within sixty days, the area plan shall go into
- 14 effect at the beginning of the fiscal year. If the department
- 15 through the Office for the Aging disapproves the area plan, it
- 16 shall forward the reasons for disapproval to the area agency
- 17 which shall have twenty days to resubmit an amended area plan.
- 18 If the department through the Office for the Aging approves the
- 19 resubmitted area plan, it shall be effective at the beginning of
- 20 the fiscal year. If the resubmitted area plan is disapproved,
- 21 the department through the Office for the Aging shall forward
- 22 its revised area plan for implementation by the area agency at
- 23 the beginning of the fiscal year: Provided, That the department
- 24 shall hold a hearing in the area prior to such action and that
- 25 the department may authorize the continuation of the provision
- 26 of services under the current area plan for a period not to
- 27 exceed ninety days.
- 28 Section 613. Allocation of Resources. -- (a) The area agency
- 29 shall receive a basic allocation of available State and Federal
- 30 <u>funds</u>, <u>based upon the proportion of low</u> income older persons who

- 1 reside in the planning and service area in relation to the total
- 2 <u>number of low income older persons who reside in the</u>
- 3 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, except that each area agency is
- 4 entitled to a minimum allocation of resources as uniformly
- 5 established by the commissioner with the approval of the
- 6 <u>secretary</u>.
- 7 (b) The deputy secretary may allocate additional resources
- 8 to area agencies based upon the total number of older persons
- 9 who reside within the planning and service area, the number of
- 10 <u>older persons institutionalized, the availability of</u>
- 11 <u>transportation services</u>, the rural-urban distribution of older
- 12 persons, the need for social and medical services, the amount of
- 13 <u>funds devoted by county commissioners for older persons and</u>
- 14 other special circumstances as determined by the deputy
- 15 <u>secretary</u>.
- 16 (c) Funds appropriated to carry out the purposes of this act
- 17 shall be distributed to the local authorities as grants for
- 18 services to the aging, provided that the local authority has
- 19 submitted an acceptable plan.
- Section  $\frac{2}{2}$ . This act shall take effect immediately.
