AN ACT

Amending the act of May 22, 1945 (P.L.837, No.337), entitled, as 2 amended, "An act providing for and requiring in certain cases 3 preference in appointments to and retention in public position or on public works for honorably discharged persons 5 who served in the military or naval service during any war or 6 armed conflict in which the United States engaged or served 7 therein since July 27, 1953, or hereafter so serves including service in Vietnam; and in certain cases for the widows and 8 wives of such persons, " further providing for certain 9 10 preferences for disabled veterans. 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. Section 3, act of May 22, 1945 (P.L.837, No.337), 14 entitled, as amended, "An act providing for and requiring in 15 certain cases preference in appointments to and retention in public position or on public works for honorably discharged 17 persons who served in the military or naval service during any 18 war or armed conflict in which the United States engaged or served therein since July 27, 1953, or hereafter so serves 19 including service in Vietnam; and in certain cases for the 20

widows and wives of such persons," is reenacted and amended to

- 2 Section 3. Whenever any soldier shall successfully pass a
- 3 civil service appointment or promotional examination for a
- 4 public position under the Commonwealth, or any political
- 5 subdivision thereof, and shall thus establish that he possesses
- 6 the qualifications required by law for appointment to or
- 7 promotion in such public position, such soldier's examination
- 8 shall be marked or graded an additional ten points, and in the
- 9 case of a disabled veteran so certified by the United States
- 10 <u>Veterans' Administration, fifteen points</u> above the mark or grade
- 11 credited for the examination, and the total mark or grade thus
- 12 obtained shall represent the final mark or grade of such
- 13 soldier, and shall determine his standing on any eligible or
- 14 promotional list, certified or furnished to the appointing or
- 15 promoting power.
- Section 2. Section 6.1 of the act, added June 25, 1947
- 17 (P.L.939, No.392), is amended to read:
- 18 Section 6.1. Whenever a reduction in force is necessary in
- 19 any public position, or on public works of this Commonwealth and
- 20 its political subdivisions, and personnel are discharged
- 21 according to seniority, the number of years of service of any
- 22 soldier shall be determined by adding his total years of service
- 23 in the civil service or on public works to his total years of
- 24 service as a member of the armed forces of the United States, or
- 25 in any women's organization officially connected therewith
- 26 during any war in which the United States engaged. <u>Disabled</u>
- 27 veterans shall not be discharged in any such case.
