## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	To provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1975.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
10	"General Appropriation Act of 1975."
11	Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be
12	necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General
13	Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive,
14	Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the
15	payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel
16	expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees
17	of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services
18	rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services,
19	printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any

other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1975 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1975.

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payments shall be made to the County Treasurer 1 and in cities of the first class coterminous with 2 3 counties of the first class to the City Treasurer: 4 And, provided further, That in the event the amount 5 herein appropriated is not sufficient to reimburse all such costs, payments shall be made to the 6 7 counties in the proportion which the costs of 8 each county bears to the total costs of all counties 9 during the most recently completed fiscal year: 10 And provided further, That in making allocations 11 and payments hereunder, the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania shall, except for county offices 12 13 of justices and judges of the Supreme and, Superior <----AND COMMONWEALTH Courts, exclude all costs which are not 14 <----15 properly reportable under the heading herein-16 above specified..... 14,000,000 Section 3. This act is not intended to be inconsistent with 17 18 or to repeal any provision of any act enacted at this or any 19 prior session of the General Assembly regulating the purchase of 20 supplies, the ordering of printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and use of automobiles, the method of making 21 22 payments from the State Treasury for any purpose or the 23 functioning of any administrative department, board or 24 commission. 25 Section 4. No appropriation made by this act to any 26 department, board, commission or agency of the Executive 27 Department shall be available unless and until such department,

28 board, commission or agency shall have complied with sections 29 604, 605 and 606 of The Administrative Code of 1929.

30 Section 5. The term "employees" as used in this act shall 19750H1336B1793 - 59 - include all directors, superintendents, bureau or division
 chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents,
 assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors,
 draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors,
 examiners, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers,
 bookkeepers, messengers and other assistants in any department,
 board or commission.

8 Section 6. The term "expenses" and "maintenance" shall include all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, 9 10 materials and supplies, traveling expenses, training, motor 11 vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express, and cartage, 12 postage, telephones and telegraph rentals and toll charges, 13 newspaper advertising and notices, fuel, light, heat, power and 14 water, minor construction and renovation, repairs or 15 reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of 16 real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen's compensation, 17 insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, premiums 18 on medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer 19 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance, and employee 20 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance, 21 payment of Commonwealth share of social security taxes and 22 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the 23 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery 24 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment 25 to the Department of Property and Supplies of mileage and other 26 charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for 27 permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of 28 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the 29 30 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must - 60 -19750H1336B1793

be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case
 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that
 provided under the State medical assistance program.

4 Section 7. Purchase of supplies, materials and equipment
5 shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered until
6 contracts covering said purchase have been entered into with the
7 vendors.

8 Section 8. (a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by 9 this act, moneys received in payment for food and household 10 supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except 11 inmates, by an institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale of any products of the soil, meats, 12 13 livestock, timber, or other materials sold by the department 14 shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated 15 out of the General Fund to the several respective institutions 16 for the operation and maintenance of said institutions.

17 (b) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government, or from any other 18 19 source as contributions for the programs provided herein, or as 20 payment for services or materials furnished by one institution 21 to another, except those collections designated as revenues, 22 shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated 23 out of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective 24 appropriations.

(c) In addition to any funds specifically appropriated by this act, all moneys received by a department or agency of the Commonwealth from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions or supplements to the department or agency for a program or administration of an act included in this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the 19750H1336B1793 - 61 - 1 appropriation for that program or administration of the act.

Section 9. That part of all appropriations in this act
unexpended, uncommitted and unencumbered as of June 30, 1976
shall automatically lapse as of that date.

5 Section 10. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.
