AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 2 act relating to the public school system, including certain 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 5 laws relating thereto, " providing for auxiliary services for 6 the benefit of children attending nonpublic schools in the 7 Commonwealth. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 922-A, act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, 11 No.14), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," is repealed. 12 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: Section 922.1-A. Auxiliary Services; Nonpublic School 13 14 Children. -- (a) Legislative Finding; Declaration of Policy. The 15 welfare of the Commonwealth requires that the present and future generations of school age children be assured ample opportunity 16 to develop to the fullest their intellectual capacities. To 17 further this objective, the Commonwealth provides, through tax 18

funds of the Commonwealth, auxiliary services free of charge to

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- 1 children attending public schools within the Commonwealth.
- 2 Approximately one quarter of all children in the Commonwealth,
- 3 in compliance with the compulsory attendance provisions of this
- 4 act, attend nonpublic schools. Although their parents are
- 5 taxpayers of the Commonwealth, these children do not receive
- 6 <u>auxiliary services from the Commonwealth. It is the intent of</u>
- 7 the General Assembly by this enactment to assure the providing
- 8 of such auxiliary services in such a manner that every school
- 9 <u>child in the Commonwealth will equitably share in the benefits</u>
- 10 thereof.
- 11 (b) Definitions. The following terms, whenever used or
- 12 referred to in this section, shall have the following meanings,
- 13 except in those circumstances where the context clearly
- 14 indicates otherwise:
- "Nonpublic school" means any school, other than a public
- 16 school within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, wherein a
- 17 resident of the Commonwealth may legally fulfill the compulsory
- 18 school attendance requirements of this act and which meet the
- 19 requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Public
- 20 Law 88-352).
- 21 <u>"Auxiliary services" means career counseling and vocational</u>
- 22 quidance; diagnostic services including but not limited to
- 23 testing to ascertain physical and mental disabilities which
- 24 adversely affect the learning capabilities of children in
- 25 <u>nonpublic schools; health services; therapeutic services</u>
- 26 including but not limited to speech correction, hearing
- 27 improvement and all other learning disabilities; driver's
- 28 <u>education; to the extent that such services are available to</u>
- 29 <u>children enrolled in public schools within the intermediate</u>
- 30 unit.

- 1 (c) Provision of Services. Pursuant to rules and regulations
- 2 <u>established</u> by the <u>secretary</u>, <u>each intermediate unit shall</u>
- 3 provide auxiliary services to all children who are enrolled in
- 4 grades kindergarten through twelve in nonpublic schools wherein
- 5 the requirements of the compulsory attendance provisions of this
- 6 act may be met and which are located within the area served by
- 7 the intermediate unit, such auxiliary services to be provided on
- 8 public school premises. In the event an intermediate unit
- 9 <u>indicates by certification that the services in any instance</u>
- 10 cannot be provided on public school premises because of
- 11 personnel, time, or space limitations or because the costs of
- 12 <u>transportation of nonpublic school children to public school</u>
- 13 premises for such auxiliary purposes are prohibitive, then such
- 14 auxiliary services may be provided on nonpublic school premises
- 15 <u>in such instances. No such auxiliary services shall be provided</u>
- 16 unless the parents of each nonpublic school pupil for whom they
- 17 are to be provided request such services from the intermediate
- 18 unit on forms prescribed by the secretary. The secretary shall
- 19 each year, beginning July 1, 1975, apportion to each
- 20 intermediate unit an amount equal to the cost of providing such
- 21 <u>services but in no case shall the amount apportioned be in</u>
- 22 excess of forty-five dollars (\$45) per pupil enrolled in
- 23 nonpublic schools within the area served by the intermediate
- 24 unit.
- 25 Section 3. If a part of this act is invalid, all valid parts
- 26 that are severable from the invalid part remain in effect. If a
- 27 part of this act is invalid, in one or more of its applications,
- 28 the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are
- 29 severable from the invalid applications.
- 30 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
