AN ACT

- 1 Creating a commission on Pennsylvania's future; setting forth
- 2 its duties and making an appropriation.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Commission on Pennsylvania's Future. -- There is
- 6 hereby created a commission on Pennsylvania's future hereinafter
- 7 referred to as the "commission."
- 8 Section 2. Membership.--(a) The commission shall consist of
- 9 50 members who shall be appointed by the Governor. Of the
- 10 members appointed there shall be at least one from each
- 11 Congressional district in the Commonwealth.
- 12 (b) The members of the commission shall serve for a term
- 13 ending December 30, 1978.
- 14 (c) The chairman shall be appointed by the Governor and
- 15 serve at his pleasure. The Governor shall fill vacancies by
- 16 appointing members similarly qualified to the members being
- 17 replaced.

- 1 (d) The Secretary of Community Affairs, the Budget
- 2 Secretary, the Secretary of Administration, the Secretary of
- 3 Commerce, the Secretary of Agriculture and the Director of the
- 4 Office of State Planning and Development shall serve as ex
- 5 officio members of the commission.
- 6 Section 3. Compensation. -- The members of the commission,
- 7 except for ex officio members, shall be paid \$50 for each day
- 8 the commission shall meet. In addition, each member shall be
- 9 allowed actual and necessary expenses incurred in the discharge
- 10 of his duty, in the manner and amount of State employees.
- 11 Section 4. Duties.--The duties of the commission shall be:
- 12 to prepare, for consideration by the Governor and the General
- 13 Assembly, a proposed State growth and development strategy; to
- 14 prepare reports assembling relevant information regarding the
- 15 State's future; to examine the long range plans of State
- 16 departments and agencies and to assess their possible impact on
- 17 State growth and development; and to report to the Governor and
- 18 the General Assembly at regular intervals on the development
- 19 implications of major State decisions. A report of the
- 20 commission shall be submitted to the Governor not later than
- 21 November 30 of each year. This requirement in no way affects the
- 22 freedom of the commission to submit recommendations and
- 23 legislative proposals whenever it considers it appropriate to do
- 24 so. Recommendations and proposals shall be to the fullest extent
- 25 possible, in the form of alternatives from which the Governor
- 26 and the General Assembly can select a preferred course of
- 27 action, policy, plan, strategy or legislative program. In the
- 28 performance of these duties, the commission shall, whenever
- 29 possible, consult with citizen groups, farm, business and labor
- 30 organizations, and other agencies and organizations, including

- 1 agencies of the Federal Government concerned with Pennsylvania's
- 2 future.
- 3 Section 5. Access to Information; State Agencies. -- The
- 4 commission shall be provided information, reports, or other
- 5 assistance from any agency, department, legislative committee or
- 6 other instrumentality of the State, with the consent of the head
- 7 thereof. All State agencies and other official State
- 8 organizations and all persons shall provide to the commission
- 9 all relevant information and reasonable assistance on any matter
- 10 of research or data within their knowledge or control. The joint
- 11 legislative committee shall have equal access to all the
- 12 resources mentioned above. A common data base shall be employed
- 13 by the commission and the joint committee.
- 14 Section 6. Administration and Staff Support.--The office of
- 15 State Planning and Development together with the Department of
- 16 Community Affairs shall provide all necessary and administrative
- 17 and professional support to the commission. All staff employed
- 18 by the commission shall be considered either employees of the
- 19 office of State Planning and Development or the Department of
- 20 Community Affairs and shall be appointed by the director or
- 21 secretary after consultation with the chairman of the
- 22 commission.
- 23 Section 7. Joint Legislative Review. -- A joint legislative
- 24 committee shall be established by the commission to review the
- 25 commission reports, evaluate the alternatives, identify
- 26 legislative priorities and develop a planning capability
- 27 consistent with the task of this commission. This committee
- 28 shall consist of three Senators appointed by the President pro
- 29 tempore; three by the minority leader; three Representatives
- 30 appointed by the Speaker of the House; and three by the House

- 1 Minority Leader. All shall serve at the will and pleasure of the
- 2 appointing authority as long as they are members of the General
- 3 Assembly and vacancies shall be filled within 60 days. All shall
- 4 be ex officio members of the commission.
- 5 Section 8. Expiration. -- This act shall be effective until
- 6 December 30, 1978.
- 7 Section 9. Appropriation.--The sum of \$100,000 or as much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated to the office
- 9 of State Planning and Development and a like amount to the
- 10 Department of Community Affairs to carry out the provisions of
- 11 this act.
- 12 Section 10. Effective Date. -- This act shall take effect
- 13 immediately.
