AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, more specifically defining obscene.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 5903 of Title 18, act
- 6 of November 25, 1970 (P.L.707, No.230), known as the
- 7 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, added December 6, 1972
- 8 (P.L.1482, No.334), is amended to read:
- 9 § 5903. Obscenity.
- 10 * * *
- 11 (b) Obscene defined.--"Obscene," as used in this section,
- 12 means that which [to the average person applying contemporary
- 13 community standards, has as its dominant theme, taken as a
- 14 whole, an appeal to prurient interest]:
- 15 (1) the average person, applying contemporary community
- 16 standards, would find, taken as a whole, appeals to the

1 prurient interest; (2) depicts or describes, in a patently offensive way: 2 3 (i) ultimate sexual acts, normal or perverted, actual or simulated, or 4 5 (ii) masturbation excretory functions and lewd exhibition of the genitals; and 6 (3) taken as a whole, lacks serious literary, artistic, 7 political or scientific value. 8 9 * * *

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
