AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the reporting of certain cases of cancer to the
- 2 Department of Health, the use of the information obtained,
- 3 and prescribing penalties.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. (a) The physician, clinic, hospital, medical or
- 7 treatment facility detecting a case of cancer shall promptly
- 8 report it to the Department of Health.
- 9 (b) The report of cancer shall state the full name, address
- 10 of the residence, place of employment and type of work of the
- 11 patient. It shall identify the type of cancer, if determined,
- 12 and the physiological area of the patient which is affected.
- 13 Section 2. (a) The Department of Health shall maintain an
- 14 accurate record of cases of cancer reported to it pursuant to
- 15 the provisions of this act. The record shall include the place
- 16 of employment and the type of work of the afflicted.
- 17 (b) The Department of Health shall maintain a cross-
- 18 reference system prepared from the data obtained in the reports

- 1 submitted to it. It shall include sections indicating the
- 2 prevalence of cases of cancer of different kinds and the types
- 3 of employment of those affected with the ailment on a political
- 4 subdivision basis.
- 5 Section 3. The information collected by the Department of
- 6 Health under this act may be disclosed by it to other Federal,
- 7 State and private research agencies interested in the problem of
- 8 cancer to aid them in cancer research and the prevention of the
- 9 disease.
- 10 Section 4. Willful failure or refusal to file a report
- 11 required by this act shall constitute a summary offense.
- 12 Conviction thereof shall be punishable by a fine of \$300 or
- 13 imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both.
- 14 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
