HOUSE RESOLUTION No. 62 Session of 1975

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON RULES, MARCH 3, 1975

In the House of Representatives, February 26, 1975 WHEREAS, The combined forces of uncontrolled inflation and the rising cost of energy are crushing the American consumer in an economic vise. That consumer is looking to a responsive and concerned government to show awareness of his plight and to take positive and deliberate action. This must be a primary concern of every agency of State Government; and

7 WHEREAS, The act of May 28, 1937 (P.L.1053, No.286), known as 8 the "Public Utility Law," has become outdated during the course of the past thirty-eight years. Its many original salutory 9 amendments have created so many inconsistencies and ambiguities 10 11 as to make its usefulness questionable in light of a fast 12 changing society and recent circumstances. A complete and indepth reevaluation of the law is needed in order to insure to 13 14 the consumers of this Commonwealth the best available 15 responsiveness by their Government; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives 16

1 shall appoint nine members, five from the Majority Party and 2 four from the Minority Party who shall constitute a special 3 committee to investigate and evaluate in depth the "Public 4 Utility Law" and to make recommendations to improve and 5 modernize said law; and be it further

6 RESOLVED, That the committee may hold public hearings, take 7 testimony, and make its study at such places as it deems 8 necessary within this Commonwealth. It may provide itself with a 9 competent staff drawing on such outside expertise as it deems 10 necessary. It may issue subpoenas under the hand and seal of its 11 chairman commanding any person to appear before it and answer questions touching matters properly being inquired into by the 12 13 committee and to produce such books, papers, records and 14 documents as the committee deems necessary. Such subpoenas may 15 be served upon any person and shall have the force and effect of 16 subpoenas issued out of the courts of this Commonwealth. Any 17 person who wilfully neglects or refuses to testify before the 18 committee or to produce any books, papers, records or documents, 19 shall be subject to the penalties provided by the laws of the Commonwealth in such case. Each member of the committee shall 20 21 have power to administer oaths and affirmations to witnesses 22 appearing before the committee; and be it further 23 RESOLVED, That within thirty calendar days after the 24 committee has made its report, the chairman of the committee 25 shall cause a record of all expenses incurred by the committee, 26 or the members thereof, which are payable at Commonwealth 27 expense, to be filed with the Speaker of the House and the 28 Speaker shall cause the same to be entered in the journal 29 thereof. No expenses incurred by the committee or any member 30 thereof shall be reimbursable by the Chief Clerk unless such 19750H0062R0683 - 2 -

expense shall first have been included as an expense item in the
record heretofore required; and be it further

3 RESOLVED, That the committee shall make a complete report of 4 its findings and conclusions to the General Assembly within one 5 year.
