- 1 WHEREAS, Title II offices of the Federal Government handle
- 2 matters under the supervision of the United States Department of
- 3 Health; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is presently served by four hearing and
- 5 appeal offices located in Johnstown, Wilkes-Barre, Philadelphia
- 6 and Washington, D. C.. Each serves a large metropolitan area in
- 7 which it is located.
- 8 The Harrisburg area of central Pennsylvania is adversely
- 9 effected by the lack of a Title II office. Long delays are
- 10 experienced by residents in the handling of their cases.
- 11 Taxpayers must pay for greatly increased travel and per diem
- 12 costs for judges to hear Harrisburg cases; therefore be it
- 13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives petition the
- 14 Secretary of the United States Department of Health Education
- 15 and Welfare to favorably consider the establishment of a Title
- 16 II office in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, to afford residents of
- 17 that region of the Commonwealth the services of such an office;
