## A SUPPLEMENT

To the act of November 30, 1965 (P.L.843, No.355), entitled "An

act providing for the establishment and operation of Temple University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in
tuition; providing for public support and capital
improvements; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be
fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the
auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from
taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to
make an annual report of the operations of Temple
University, " making appropriations for carrying the same into
effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriation and providing a method of accounting for the
funds appropriated.
The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be
necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees
of Temple University at Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1,
1975 to June 30, 1976, for the purposes and in the amounts as
shown:

(1) For net cost of instruction excluding

- 3 (3) For instruction Doctor of Medicine
- 5 Section 2. Payments to Temple University on account of the
- 6 appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1, except
- 7 for instruction Doctor of Medicine, shall be made on the basis
- 8 of net costs during the fiscal year.
- 9 Payments for instruction Doctor of Medicine only shall be
- 10 made on the basis of full-time equivalent students enrolled at
- 11 the rate of \$7,465 per student.
- 12 Section 3. If necessary, Temple University may transfer
- 13 funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1)
- 14 and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or
- 15 out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not
- 16 exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that
- 17 purpose.
- 18 Section 4. There shall be no further disbursement of funds
- 19 appropriated for Temple University after September 30, 1975,
- 20 until the Chairpersons of the House and Senate Appropriations
- 21 Committees and the Chairpersons of the House and Senate
- 22 Education Committees have received copies of letters notifying
- 23 at least a 5% reduction of the current full-time faculty members
- 24 or full-time equivalent faculty members, and at least a 5%
- 25 reduction of the current administrators and one vice-president
- 26 at the university as of September 1, 1976. When the Chairpersons
- 27 of the respective committees have received proof of reduction
- 28 notification they shall then notify the Treasurer of the
- 29 Commonwealth who may authorize disbursements from appropriated
- 30 funds to the university.

- 1 As an additional condition precedent to the disbursement of
- 2 appropriated funds after September 30, 1975 to the university,
- 3 the university shall furnish satisfactory evidence to the
- 4 Chairpersons of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees
- 5 and the Chairpersons of the House and Senate Education
- 6 Committees that, commencing with the academic year that begins
- 7 in September 1975, all programs of academic fee remission and
- 8 tuition waiver for all employees of the university are
- 9 abolished.
- 10 Section 5. Payment to Temple University of the
- 11 appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the
- 12 fiscal year.
- 13 Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the
- 14 provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated net
- 15 costs and full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor
- 16 of Medicine program. The estimate of net costs shall be
- 17 submitted by Temple University to the Secretary of Education,
- 18 the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than
- 19 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.
- 20 Section 6. Temple University shall apply the moneys
- 21 appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted
- 22 in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records
- 23 showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days
- 24 after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates,
- 25 Temple University shall file with the Secretary of Education,
- 26 the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the
- 27 Commonwealth a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes
- 28 of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act
- 29 and other university accounts during said fiscal year the number
- 30 of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of

- 1 Medicine program and net costs, as provided in section 2, used
- 2 as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal
- 3 year. Such statement of expenditures, and number of full-time
- 4 equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program
- 5 and net costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the
- 6 Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the
- 7 moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow
- 8 expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to
- 9 cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Temple University to
- 10 the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall
- 11 also make a determination of full-time equivalent students
- 12 enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and net costs and
- 13 make certification as to their correctness. In respect to
- 14 expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those
- 15 appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the
- 16 right to review only and he shall file annually with the General
- 17 Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the
- 18 General Assembly or any of its committees may require.
- 19 Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and
- 20 the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and
- 21 House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs
- 22 of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program. The
- 23 report, to be submitted prior to November 1, 1976, shall cover
- 24 the twelve-month period beginning September 1, 1975. The report
- 25 shall include for each term during the period:
- 26 (1) The following counts and distributions:
- 27 (i) The definitions and numbers of full-time faculty
- 28 members, of part-time faculty members, of full-time students
- 29 enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in
- 30 undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in

- 1 graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in
- 2 undergraduate courses.
- 3 (ii) A distribution of part-time faculty members by the
- 4 percentage of full-time employment.
- 5 (iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours,
- 6 divided into lower division and upper division levels, and of
- 7 graduate student credit hours divided into three levels --
- 8 master's, first professional and doctoral.
- 9 (iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of
- 10 instruction, distributed by the number of sections scheduled in
- 11 each course and the sections distributed by the number of
- 12 students enrolled in each section.
- (v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.
- 14 (2) A classification of faculty members or other
- 15 professional employees by title including: professor, associate
- 16 professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research
- 17 associate, librarian, and academic administrator; faculty
- 18 members or other professional employees under each title to be
- 19 subdivided by type of assignment: undergraduate courses only,
- 20 graduate courses only, or both graduate and undergraduate
- 21 courses; and each such set of faculty members or other
- 22 professional employees to be further subdivided by type of
- 23 employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates
- 24 for each such subdivided classification:
- 25 (i) The number.
- 26 (ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate courses
- 27 and the sum of credits assigned to graduate courses taught,
- 28 divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first
- 29 professional and doctoral levels.
- 30 (iii) The sum of undergraduate student credit hours and the

- 1 sum of graduate student credit hours generated; divided into
- 2 lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and
- 3 doctoral levels.
- 4 (iv) Total salary paid.
- 5 (v) Total salary paid from university funds.
- 6 (vi) Total salary paid from Federal funds.
- 7 (vii) Total salary paid from other funds.
- 8 (3) For each term of the period covered for each full-time
- 9 faculty member identified by school, department and title:
- 10 (i) An analysis of the average hours per week spent in
- 11 university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent
- 12 in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom
- 13 contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and
- 14 hours spent in public service.
- 15 (ii) The total salary paid and the salary paid from
- 16 university funds.
- 17 Section 8. In addition to the requirements of section 7, the
- 18 report covering the twelve-month period beginning September 1,
- 19 1975, shall include for all programs of the university except
- 20 the Doctor of Medicine program:
- 21 (1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate
- 22 degree, and for a master's degree.
- 23 (2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first
- 24 professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1973, 1974
- 25 and 1975 and estimated 1976.
- 26 Section 9. The university shall report its revenues and
- 27 expenditures and present its financial statements required under
- 28 the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted
- 29 accounting principles and procedures for educational
- 30 institutions as set forth in "The Industry Audit Guide for

- 1 Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of
- 2 Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.
- 3 Section 10. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.
