A SUPPLEMENT

1 To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act  
2 to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to  
3 the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural  
4 Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into  
5 effect, providing for a basis for payments of such  
6 appropriations and providing a method of accounting for the  
7 funds appropriated.

8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
9 hereby enacts as follows:

10 Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of  
11 Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the  
12 several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of  
13 Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of  
14 Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said  
15 acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry  
16 the same into effect, the following sums or as much thereof as  
17 may be necessary are hereby specifically appropriated to the  
18 Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal  
19 year July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for the purposes and in the  
20 amounts as shown:

21 (1) For net cost of instruction excluding

1	Doctor of Medicine.....	\$72,250,000
2	(2) For net cost of student aid.....	1,760,000
3	(3) For net cost of extension and public	
4	services.....	9,626,000
5	(4) For net cost of research.....	15,361,000
6	(5) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine	
7	only.....	2,665,000

8 Section 2. Payments to Pennsylvania State University on  
9 account of the appropriations for all items as provided in  
10 section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be  
11 made on the basis of net costs during the fiscal year.

12 Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made  
13 on the basis of full-time equivalent students enrollment at the  
14 rate of \$7,465 per student.

15 Section 3. If necessary, the Pennsylvania State University  
16 may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1,  
17 clauses (1), (2), (3) and (4): Provided, That the aggregate  
18 amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the  
19 fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically  
20 appropriated for that purpose.

21 Section 4. There shall be no further disbursement of funds  
22 appropriated for the Pennsylvania State University after  
23 September 30, 1975, until the chairpersons of the House and  
24 Senate Appropriations Committees and the chairpersons of the  
25 House and Senate Education Committees have received copies of  
26 letters notifying at least a 5% reduction of the current full-  
27 time faculty members or full-time equivalent faculty members and  
28 at least a 5% reduction of the current administrators and one  
29 vice-president at the university as of September 1, 1976. When  
30 the chairpersons of the respective committees have received

1 proof of retrenchment notification they shall then notify the  
2 Treasurer of the Commonwealth who may authorize disbursements  
3 from appropriated funds to the university.

4 As an additional condition precedent to the disbursement of  
5 appropriated funds after September 30, 1975 to the university,  
6 the university shall furnish satisfactory evidence to the  
7 chairpersons of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees  
8 and the chairpersons of the House and Senate Education  
9 Committees that, commencing with the academic year that begins  
10 in September 1975, all programs of academic fee remission and  
11 tuition waiver for all employees of the university are  
12 abolished.

13 Section 5. Payments to the Pennsylvania State University of  
14 the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during  
15 the fiscal year.

16 Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the  
17 provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated net  
18 costs and full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor  
19 of Medicine program. The estimate of net costs shall be  
20 submitted by the Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary  
21 of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer  
22 not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment  
23 is to be made.

24 Section 6. The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the  
25 moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are  
26 permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper  
27 records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than  
28 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act  
29 relates, the Pennsylvania State University shall file with the  
30 Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, and with the

1 Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth  
2 the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys  
3 appropriated by this act and other university accounts during  
4 said fiscal year, the number of full-time equivalent students  
5 enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and net costs, as  
6 provided in sections 2 and 3, used as a basis for receipt of any  
7 appropriation during said fiscal year.

8       Such statement of expenditures and number of full-time  
9 equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program  
10 and net costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the  
11 Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the  
12 moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow  
13 expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to  
14 cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the Pennsylvania  
15 State University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The  
16 Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time  
17 equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program  
18 and net costs and make a certification as to their correctness.  
19 In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys  
20 other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General  
21 shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually  
22 with the General Assembly such information concerning such  
23 expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees  
24 may require.

25       Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and  
26 the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and  
27 House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs  
28 of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program. The  
29 report, to be submitted prior to November 1, 1976, shall cover  
30 the twelve-month period beginning September 1, 1975. The report

1 shall include for each term during the period.

2 (1) The following counts and distributions:

3 (i) The definitions and numbers of full-time faculty  
4 members, of part-time faculty members, of full-time students  
5 enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in  
6 undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in  
7 graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in  
8 undergraduate courses.

9 (ii) A distribution of part-time faculty members by the  
10 percentage of full-time employment.

11 (iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours,  
12 divided into lower division and upper division levels, and of  
13 graduate student credit hours divided into three levels--  
14 master's, first professional and doctoral.

15 (iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of  
16 instruction, distributed by the number of sections scheduled in  
17 each course and the sections distributed by the number of  
18 students enrolled in each section.

19 (v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

20 (2) A classification of faculty members or other  
21 professional employees by title including: professor, associate  
22 professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research  
23 associate, librarian, and academic administrator; faculty  
24 members or other professional employees under each title to be  
25 subdivided by type of assignment: undergraduate courses only,  
26 graduate courses only, or both graduate and undergraduate  
27 courses; and each such set of faculty members or other  
28 professional employees to be further subdivided by type of  
29 employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates  
30 for each such subdivided classification:

1 (i) The number.

2 (ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate courses  
3 and the sum of credits assigned to graduate courses taught,  
4 divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first  
5 professional and doctoral levels.

6 (iii) The sum of undergraduate student credit hours and the  
7 sum of graduate student credit hours generated; divided into  
8 lower division, upper division, master's first professional and  
9 doctoral levels.

10 (iv) Total salary paid.

11 (v) Total salary paid from university funds.

12 (vi) Total salary paid from Federal funds.

13 (vii) Total salary paid from other funds.

14 (3) For each term of the period covered for each full-time  
15 faculty member identified by school, department and title:

16 (i) An analysis of the average hours per week spent in  
17 university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent  
18 in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom  
19 contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and  
20 hours spent in public service.

21 (ii) The total salary paid and the salary paid from  
22 university funds.

23 Section 8. In addition to the requirements of section 7, the  
24 report covering the twelve-month period beginning September 1,  
25 1975, shall include for all programs of the university except  
26 the Doctor of Medicine program:

27 (1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate  
28 degree, and for a master's degree.

29 (2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first  
30 professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1973, 1974

1 and 1975 and estimated 1976.

2 Section 9. The Pennsylvania State University shall report  
3 its revenues and expenditures and present its financial  
4 statements required under the provisions of this act in  
5 accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and  
6 procedures for educational institutions as set forth in  
7 "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the  
8 American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973,  
9 without exception.

10 Section 10. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.
