AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- 2 act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- 3 welfare laws of the Commonwealth, " changing provisions
- 4 relating to Food Stamp Computations.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 471, act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
- 8 No.21), known as the "Public Welfare Code," is amended to read:
- 9 Section 471. Food Stamp Computations.--To compute for each
- 10 quarter the amount of Commonwealth funds expended by the
- 11 department for the administration of the food stamp program for
- 12 [each county or] every county, and for each city of the first
- 13 class. For the fiscal year 1965-1966, thirty percent; for the
- 14 fiscal year 1966-1967, forty percent; and, for the fiscal [year]
- 15 years 1967-1968, [and thereafter,] through 1974-1975 and the
- 16 <u>nine month period ending March 31, 1976</u>, fifty percent of the
- 17 amount so expended for [each county or] every county, and for
- 18 each city of the first class shall be certified to it, and shall
- 19 become its obligation to be paid to the department.
- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall
- 21 apply retroactively to April 1, 1976.
