## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, No.66), entitled "An act providing for the administration of a statewide system of vital statistics; prescribing the functions of the State 3 Department of Health, the State Advisory Health Board and 5 local registrars; imposing duties upon coroners, 6 prothonotaries, clerks of orphans' court, physicians, 7 midwives and other persons; requiring reports and 8 certificates for the registration of vital statistics; 9 regulating the disposition of dead bodies; limiting the disclosure of records; prescribing the sufficiency of vital 10 statistics records as evidence; prescribing fees and 11 penalties; and revising and consolidating the laws relating 12 13 thereto, " requiring the issuance of certified birth 14 certificates. 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 16 hereby enacts as follows: Section 401, act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, 17 Section 1. 18 No.66), known as the "Vital Statistics Law of 1953," is amended 19 to read: 20 Section 401. Birth Registration: General Provisions. -- A 21 certificate of each birth occurring in this Commonwealth shall 22 be filed with the local registrar of the district in which the birth occurs within a period prescribed by regulations of the 24 Advisory Health Board. The certificate shall be prepared, signed

- 1 and filed by the attending physician or licensed midwife, except
- 2 that when there is no attending physician or licensed midwife
- 3 the certificate shall be prepared, signed and filed (1) by the
- 4 father, or (2) in the event of his death, disability or absence,
- 5 by the mother, or (3) in the event of her death or disability,
- 6 by the householder of the premises or superintendent of the
- 7 institution in which the birth occurs, or (4) in the event of
- 8 the absence or disability of all persons heretofore named, then
- 9 by such person acquainted with the facts as the local registrar
- 10 shall designate. On receipt of the certificate, the bureau shall
- 11 <u>issue a certified copy of the birth certificate to the parents</u>
- 12 or parent of the child.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
