AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, adding and grading the crime of theft by conversion.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Title 18, act of November 25, 1970 (P.L.707, No. 230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, is amended by adding a section to read:
§ 3932. Theft by conversion.
(a) Offense defined.--A person is guilty of theft by conversion who purchases a thing on an installment payment system or sales contract and converts it by selling or giving it to another and thereafter refuses to satisfy the unpaid balance of the debt.
(b) Grading.--
(1) A person committing the offense of theft by
conversion is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree if
the unpaid balance of the debt is less than $\$ 300$. conversion is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree if the unpaid balance or debt is $\$ 300$ or more. Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
