INTRODUCED BY MR. PIEVSKY, JUNE 6, 1977

AS RE-REPORTED FROM COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS, HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AS AMENDED, SEPTEMBER 26, 1977

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act of November 30, 1965 (P.L.843, No.355), entitled "An 1 2 act providing for the establishment and operation of Temple University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve 3 as a State-related university in the higher education system 4 5 of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing 6 for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of 7 trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in 8 9 tuition; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be 10 fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the 11 auditing of accounts of expenditures from said 12 13 appropriations; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from 14 taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual report of the operations of Temple 15 University, " making appropriations for carrying the same into 16 17 effect, providing for a basis for payments of such 18 appropriation and providing a method of accounting for the 19 funds appropriated.

20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

21 hereby enacts as follows:

22 Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be 23 necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees 24 of Temple University at Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1, 25 1977 to June 30, 1978, for the purposes and in the amounts as 26 shown:

1 (1) For educational and general expenses..... \$58,680,000 <--2 \$58,126,000 (2) For cost of student aid..... 3 3,018,000 4 (3) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine 5,412,000 5 only..... (4) For operation of dental clinics in the 6 7 500,000 school of dentistry..... <-----8 600,000 2,500,000 9 (5) Temple University Hospital..... 10 Section 2. Payments to Temple University on account of the 11 appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1, except for instruction Doctor of Medicine, shall be made on the basis 12 13 of costs during the fiscal year. Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine only shall be 14 15 made on the basis of full-time students enrolled at the rate of 16 \$7,465 per student. 17 Section 3. If necessary, Temple University may transfer 18 funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1) 19 and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or 20 out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not 21 exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that 22 purpose. 23 Section 4. Payment to Temple University of the 24 appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the 25 fiscal year. 26 Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the 27 provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated costs 28 and full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by Temple 29

and to the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the 1 2 date on which such payment is to be made.

3 Section 5. Temple University shall apply the moneys 4 appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted 5 in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days 6 after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, 7 Temple University shall file with the Secretary of Education, 8 9 the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the 10 Commonwealth a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes 11 of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year the number 12 13 of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt 14 15 of any appropriation during said fiscal year. Such statement of 16 expenditures, and number of full-time students enrolled in the 17 Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the 18 Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to 19 20 audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted 21 by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by 22 Temple University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The 23 Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time 24 students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs 25 and make certification as to their correctness. In respect to 26 expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the 27 28 right to review only and he shall file annually with the General 29 Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the 30 General Assembly or any of its committees may require. 19770H1255B1976

1 Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Secretary of 2 Education, the Governor, and the Appropriations and Education 3 Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall 4 include data for all programs of the university except the 5 Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to October 1, 1977, shall cover the twelve month period beginning 6 July 1, 1976 and ending June 30, 1977. The report shall 7 8 include: 9 (1) For each term during the period, the following counts 10 and distributions: 11 (i) The definitions and numbers of full time faculty members, of part time faculty members, of full time graduate 12 13 students, of part time graduate students, of full time undergraduate students, and of part time undergraduate students. 14 15 (ii) A distribution of part time faculty members by the percentage of full time employment. 16 17 (iii) Definitions of course levels of instruction and the 18 number of different courses scheduled by course level, 19 distributed by the number of sections scheduled in each course 20 and the sections distributed by the number of students enrolled in each section. 21 22 (iv) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof. 23 (2) For the twelve month period, the following, distributed 24 by student level: lower division undergraduate, upper division 25 undergraduate, graduate, and first professional (excluding 26 Doctor of Medicine) within HEGIS discipline division (as defined by "A Taxonomy of Instructional Programs in Higher Education," 27 U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of 28 29 Education, 1970): (i) The number of equivalent full time students (EFTS) 30

(A) EFTS taught by HEGIS discipline will be determined from 2 3 production student credit hours (student credit hours produced by an academic department, regardless of the student majors 4 5 taking the courses). (B) EFTS taught by student level within HEGIS discipline 6 divisions will be determined by the level of the students taking 7 the courses, regardless of the course level of instruction of 8 9 the courses being taken. 10 (ii) Teaching salaries per equivalent full time student. 11 (A) Teaching salaries will be distributed by student level based on course credits taught, with equal weight given to all 12 13 course levels of instruction. 14 (B) In distributing teaching salaries, each thirty student 15 credit hours of thesis or dissertation work equals one three-16 credit section. 17 (C) In distributing teaching salaries, all students engaged 18 in independent study who are assigned to one faculty member will be considered one three credit section. 19 20 (D) Teaching salaries will be distributed by student level 21 only for those individuals budgeted for instruction as reflected 22 in Part III, "Instruction and Departmental Research," 23 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1978-1979. 24 25 (iii) Total costs per equivalent full time student. 26 (A) Direct costs other than teaching salaries will be 27 allocated by student level within HEGIS discipline division 28 based on institutional records. (B) Indirect costs of instruction will be prorated to each 29 30 student level within HEGIS discipline division as a percentage - 5 -19770H1255B1976

of direct costs. An exception will be major organized activities 1 (e.g., university farm operations, dental clinics). These 2 3 activities will be allocated directly to the related HEGIS 4 discipline group. 5 (iv) Costs to the Commonwealth per equivalent full time student. 6 (A) Total costs will be offset by income for instruction to 7 8 determine costs to the Commonwealth. 9 (B) Income for instruction derived from student tuition will 10 be allocated by HEGIS discipline and by student level based on the number of equivalent full time students and the specific 11 tuition rates for that level. 12 13 (C) Income for instruction derived from other sources and related to a specific HEGIS discipline group will be allocated 14 15 directly to that group. 16 (D) Income for instruction derived from other sources and not related to a specific HEGIS discipline group will be 17 allocated as a percentage of student tuition income. 18 19 (v) Totals by student level for all HEGIS discipline 20 divisions combined for: 21 (A) The number of equivalent full time students taught. 22 (B) Teaching salaries per equivalent full time student. 23 (C) Total costs per equivalent full time student. 24 (D) Costs to the Commonwealth per equivalent full time student. 25 26 These totals must agree with the corresponding totals in Part III, "Instruction and Departmental Research," Commonwealth of 27 Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State Related Universities, 28 Phase I, Fiscal Year 1978-1979. 29 30 (vi) All program data will be compiled from institutional 19770H1255B1976 - 6 -

8	Section 7. In addition to the requirements of section 6, the
9	report covering the twelve month period beginning July 1, 1976
10	and ending June 30, 1977, shall include for all programs of the

13	degree, and for a master's degree.
14	(2) Number of associate degrees, baccalaureate degrees,
15	master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral

18	(3) A listing of the academic departments and instructional

21	SECTION 6. A REPORT SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE GOVERNOR AND $<$
22	THE APPROPRIATIONS AND EDUCATION COMMITTEES OF THE SENATE AND
23	HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND SHALL INCLUDE DATA FOR ALL PROGRAMS
24	EXCEPT THE DOCTOR OF MEDICINE PROGRAM. EACH SUCH REPORT, TO BE
25	SUBMITTED PRIOR TO NOVEMBER 1, 1978, SHALL COVER THE 12-MONTH
26	PERIOD BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 1, 1977 AND SHALL INCLUDE FOR EACH
27	TERM DURING THE PERIOD:

THE STATE COLLEGES OR STATE-OWNED UNIVERSITY:

3 THE STATE COLLEGES AND STATE-OWNED UNIVERSITY SHALL REPORT
4 THEIR REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES AND PRESENT THEIR FINANCIAL
5 STATEMENTS REQUIRED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT IN
6 ACCORDANCE WITH HIGHER EDUCATION FINANCE MANUAL (1975).

7 Section 8. 7. The university shall provide such information <--
8 and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may
9 prescribe.

10 Section 9. 8. The university shall report its revenues and <-----11 expenditures and present its financial statements required under 12 the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted 13 accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Higher Education Finance Manual" 14 15 United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975) 16 with the exceptions set forth in the Commonwealth of 17 Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State Related Universities, 18 Phase I, Fiscal Year 1977-1978. Credits granted for non-19 traditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning etc., 20 including all related costs and revenues thereof shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under 21 "Public Service." 22
