year the General primary shall be held on the fourth Tuesday of 1 2 April. Candidates for all offices to be filled at the ensuing general election shall be nominated at the General primary. The 3 4 county political party chairman shall be elected by the party elections at the General primary. The vote for candidates for 5 the office of President of the United States, as provided for by 6 7 this act, shall be cast at the General primary. 8 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: 9 Section 807.1. Election of County Political Party 10 Chairman. -- (a) Notwithstanding any law or rule to the contrary, 11 the county political party chairman of every county political party or the city political party chairman of every city 12 13 political party where the boundaries of the county and city are 14 the same organized pursuant to section 807 shall be elected for 15 a two (2) year term of office by the party electors at each 16 General primary election. 17 (b) The candidates for the office of county political party 18 chairman shall be nominated pursuant to the provisions of 19 Article IX. 20 Section 3. by at least one hundred registered and enrolled members of the proper party, except for the office of magistrate in cities of the first class, in which case it must be signed by at least three thousand registered and enrolled members of the proper party.
