AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- 5 laws relating thereto, " further providing for the causes and
- 6 criteria for suspension, and providing for waiver of
- 7 certification requirements in certain instances.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Clause (1) of section 1124, act of March 10, 1949
- 11 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," is
- 12 amended to read:
- 13 Section 1124. Causes for Suspension. -- Any board of school
- 14 directors may suspend the necessary number of professional
- 15 employes, for any of the causes hereinafter enumerated:
- 16 (1) Substantial decrease in pupil enrollment in the school
- 17 district as approved by the department after appropriate
- 18 investigation. The percent reduction of the professional staff
- 19 shall not exceed the percent of reduction of the total pupil
- 20 population over the preceding school year;

- 2 Section 2. Section 1125 of the act is repealed.
- 3 Section 3. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
- 4 <u>Section 1125.1. Criteria for Suspension.--</u>
- 5 (a) Professional employes shall be suspended under section
- 6 <u>1124 (relating to causes for suspension) in inverse order of</u>
- 7 <u>seniority within the school entity of current employment.</u>
- 8 Approved leaves of absence shall not constitute a break in
- 9 <u>service for purposes of computing seniority for suspension</u>
- 10 purposes. Seniority shall continue to accrue during suspension
- 11 and all approved leaves of absence.
- 12 (b) Where there is or has been a consolidation of schools,
- 13 departments or programs, all professional employes shall retain
- 14 the seniority rights they had prior to the reorganization or
- 15 consolidation.
- 16 (c) A school entity shall realign its professional staff so
- 17 as to insure that more senior employes are provided with the
- 18 opportunity to fill positions for which they are certificated
- 19 and which are being filled by less senior employes.
- 20 (d) (1) No suspended employe shall be prevented from
- 21 engaging in another occupation during the period of suspension.
- 22 (2) Suspended professional employes shall be reinstated on
- 23 the basis of their seniority within the school entity. No new
- 24 appointment shall be made while there is a suspended
- 25 professional employe available who is properly certificated to
- 26 fill such vacancy. For the purpose of this subsection, positions
- 27 from which professional employes are on approved leaves of
- 28 <u>absence shall also be considered vacancies.</u>
- 29 <u>(3) To be considered available a suspended professional</u>
- 30 <u>employe must annually report to the governing board in writing</u>

- 1 his current address and his intent to accept the same or similar
- 2 position when offered.
- 3 (4) A laid off employe enrolled in a college program during
- 4 a period of suspension and who is recalled shall be given the
- 5 option of delaying his return to service until the end of the
- 6 <u>current semester</u>.
- 7 (e) Nothing contained in section 1125.1(a) through (d) shall
- 8 be construed to supersede or preempt the seniority provisions of
- 9 <u>a collective bargaining agreement negotiated by a school entity</u>
- 10 and an exclusive representative of the employes in accordance
- 11 with the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the
- 12 <u>"Public Employe Relations Act."</u>
- (f) A decision to suspend in accordance with this section
- 14 shall be considered an adjudication within the meaning of the
- 15 act of December 2, 1968, (P.L.1133, No.353), known as the "Local
- 16 Agency Law."
- 17 Section 1214. Department Waiver of Certification
- 18 Requirements. -- (a) The department shall grant a waiver of
- 19 certification requirements for a period not to exceed one year
- 20 for a certificated professional employe currently employed by or
- 21 on suspension from a school entity when the school entity
- 22 submits a written waiver request containing the following:
- 23 (i) the reason for the waiver;
- 24 (ii) a program of study being followed by the employe to
- 25 <u>secure certification in the new position;</u>
- 26 (iii) the period of time necessary for the employe to
- 27 secure certification in the new position; and
- 28 (iv) a statement showing the employe's application for
- 29 placement in the new position.
- 30 (b) The employe for whom the waiver is granted shall pursue

- 1 <u>certification as outlined in the school entity's waiver request.</u>
- 2 Failure to do so shall result in a revocation of the waiver.
- (c) A professional employe for whom a waiver is granted 3
- 4 shall not be permitted to fill a position vacated by a suspended
- 5 employe.
- Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately. 6
