In the House of Representatives, April 3, 1978

1 WHEREAS, History has shown that you cannot buy friendship of
2 nations with money or weapons, that arms are bought to be used
3 not stored, that peace lies in the hearts of men not in the
4 arsenals of wars, that morality not the short-term values of the
5 marketplace provide the best hope for peace, that our nation
6 endangers its own integrity when it strays from its promises to
7 its allies; therefore be it

8 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
9 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, alarmed that the United
10 States appears to be running out on its commitment of support
11 for Israel, disturbed that executive agencies of the United
12 States have offered to sell our most modern weapons including F-
13 5s and F-15s to Egypt and Saudi Arabia, a move that threatens to
14 upset the balance of power in the Middle East and engulf that
15 region in yet another war that could destroy Israel, a tiny
16 island of free enterprise democracy in an ocean of fascistic and
17 communistic states, does hereby call on the Congress of the

1 United States to block such proposed sale; and be it further
2 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
3 the presiding officers of each House of the Congress of the
4 United States and to each Senator and Representative from
5 Pennsylvania in the Congress of the United States.
