## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for alteration of
- 3 identification mark on movable personal property.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 4104 of Title 18, act of November 25,
- 7 1970 (P.L.707, No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes, is amended to read:
- 9 § 4104. Tampering with records or identification.
- 10 (a) Writings.-- A person commits a misdemeanor of the first
- 11 degree if, knowing that he has no privilege to do so, he
- 12 falsifies, destroys, removes or conceals any writing or record,
- 13 or distinguishing mark or brand or other identification with
- 14 intent to deceive or injure anyone or to conceal any wrongdoing.
- (b) Personal movable property. -- A person commits a summary <--
- 16 offense if he knowingly buys, sells, or moves in commerce any
- 17 movable personal property which includes a radio, citizens band

- 1 radio, tape recorder, tape player, piano, phonograph, sewing
- 2 <u>machine</u>, <u>washing machine</u>, <u>typewriter</u>, <u>adding machine</u>,
- 3 <u>comptometer</u>, <u>bicycle</u>, <u>binocular</u>, <u>vacuum cleaner</u>, <u>camera</u>,
- 4 projector, watch, watch movement, watch case, or any mechanical
- 5 <u>or electrical device, appliance, contrivance, material, piece of</u>
- 6 apparatus or equipment but does not exclude items not mentioned,
- 7 from which the manufacturer's name plate, serial number or any
- 8 <u>other distinguishing number or identification mark has been</u>
- 9 removed, defaced, covered, altered or destroyed unless the
- 10 alterations have been customarily made or done as an established
- 11 practice in the ordinary and regular conduct of business by the
- 12 <u>original manufacturer or under specific authorization and</u>
- 13 <u>direction from the original manufacturer</u>. <u>Movable personal</u>
- 14 PERSONAL property as set forth in this subsection shall not <-

- 15 <u>include firearms</u>, motor vehicles or insurance company salvage
- 16 <u>recoveries</u>.
- 17 (C) INNOCENT ALTERATIONS.--IF PROPERTY SUBJECT TO THE
- 18 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION HAS HAD ITS IDENTIFYING MARKS DEFACED
- 19 OR ELIMINATED INNOCENTLY AND IS IN THE POSSESSION OF ITS
- 20 RIGHTFUL OWNER, THE OWNER MAY, NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF
- 21 SUBSECTION (A) OR (B), DISPOSE OF THE PROPERTY BY SALE OR
- 22 OTHERWISE, IF HE DELIVERS TO THE ACQUIRER A NOTARIZED STATEMENT
- 23 THAT THE PROPERTY WAS INNOCENTLY ALTERED AND THAT THE PERSON
- 24 DISPOSING OF IT IS ITS RIGHTFUL OWNER.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
