| 13 | shall be permitted to present, on a subsequent appeal, any issue |
| 14 | or matter which was properly and timely raised during the course |
| 15 | of or prior to the trial. |
| 16 | Section 2. The trial judge may in his discretion give leave |
| 17 | for the filing of such motions within such time as he shall fix. |
| 18 | Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately. |
