## AN ACT

- Amending the act of August 20, 1977 (No.11-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal period July 1, 1977 to June 30, 1978, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1977, "changing certain appropriations.

  The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Section 2, act of August 20, 1977 (No.11-A),
- 11 known as the "General Appropriation Act of 1977," is amended by

printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any 1 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for 2 3 the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and 4 for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period 5 beginning July 1, 1977 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 6 30, 1977. 7 8 I. 20	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that $\underline{\text{all}}$ moneys
21	made available to the Legislative Department remaining unspent
22	and unencumbered from appropriations made for <u>all prior</u> fiscal
23	[year 1975-1976] <u>years</u> shall lapse into the General Fund.
24	(c) The appropriations to the Legislative Department shall
25	be continuing appropriations.
