AN ACT

Amending the act of August 31, 1966 (1st Sp.Sess., P.L.47, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the assignment of former judges learned in the law to sit temporarily in the courts of any judicial district for the disposal of business, and providing for their compensation," providing that nothing in this act shall be construed as prohibiting any former judge from serving without compensation.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 6, act of August 31, 1966 (1st Sp.Sess., P.L.47, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the assignment of former judges learned in the law to sit temporarily in the courts of any judicial district for the disposal of business, and providing for their compensation," is amended to read:

Section 6. (a) When any former judge, learned in the law, is assigned as provided by this act to assist the judge or judges of any judicial district, the former judge so assigned shall be entitled to receive, for each day he is actually engaged in the performance of such duty, the sum of seventy-five dollars (\$75) per day and the actual traveling expenses not in
excess of ten cents (10ç) for each mile traveled to and from the
place of holding court in such district.
(b) Nothing in this section shall be construed as
prohibiting any former judge from serving without compensation
if he is willing to do so.
Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
