AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 27, 1927 (P.L.465, No.299), entitled, 2 as amended, "An act to provide for the safety of persons 3 employed, housed, or assembled in certain buildings and structures not in cities of the first class, second class, 5 and second class A, by requiring certain construction and 6 ways of egress, equipment, and maintenance; providing for the 7 licensing of projectionists, except in cities of the first 8 class and second class; requiring the submission of plans for 9 examination and approval; providing for the promulgation of rules and regulations for the enforcement of this act; 10 providing for the enforcement of this act by the Department 11 of Labor and Industry and, in certain cases, by the chiefs of 12 fire departments in cities of the third class; providing 13 14 penalties for violations of the provisions of this act; and repealing certain acts," authorizing the installation of an 15 electronic smoke detector system in lieu of an automatic 16 17 water sprinkler system in certain Class I buildings. 18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 19 20 Section 1. Section 1, act of April 27, 1927 (P.L.465, No.299), referred to as the Fire and Panic Act, amended May 28, 21 22 1937 (P.L.1016, No.281), is amended to read: 23 Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That,
- 25 erected or adapted for any of the purposes of the several

General Requirement. -- Every building enumerated in this act,

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- 1 classes of buildings covered by this act, shall be so
- 2 constructed, equipped, operated, and maintained, with respect to
- 3 type of construction and materials used, fireproofing, number
- 4 and type of ways of egress, aisles and passageways, stairs and
- 5 fire escapes, wall openings, exits and exit signs, doors and
- 6 doorways, shaftways and other vertical openings, emergency
- 7 lighting, automatic sprinkler systems or electronic smoke
- 8 <u>detector systems</u>, fire alarm systems, fire drills, electrical
- 9 equipment, inflammable and explosive materials, heating
- 10 apparatus and fuel storage, number of occupants, ventilation,
- 11 arrangement of seating and standing space, construction and
- 12 equipment of stages, projection rooms, and dressing rooms, and
- 13 all other fire and panic protection as to provide for the safety
- 14 and health of all persons employed, accommodated, housed, or
- 15 assembled therein. Whenever any building designated in this act
- 16 shall, in the opinion of the Department of Labor and Industry,
- 17 become dangerous to further occupancy because of structural or
- 18 other defects, it shall immediately be closed to further
- 19 occupancy, and a sign posted thereon to that effect. Such
- 20 building shall not again be occupied until all recommendations
- 21 of the department to eliminate hazardous conditions are complied
- 22 with.
- 23 The Department of Labor and Industry shall have the power,
- 24 and its duty shall be, to make, alter, amend, or repeal rules
- 25 and regulations for carrying into effect all of the provisions
- 26 of this act, applying such provisions to specific conditions,
- 27 and prescribing means, methods and practices to make effective
- 28 such provisions.
- 29 Section 2. Section 3 of the act, amended April 11, 1939
- 30 (P.L.18, No.17), is amended to read:

- 1 Section 3. Special Requirements. -- There shall be installed
- 2 such emergency lighting systems, sprinkler systems, and fire
- 3 alarm systems, in such of the buildings enumerated in this act
- 4 as the Department of Labor and Industry may specify and which in
- 5 its judgment are necessary to give proper protection from fire
- 6 and panic to those employed, assembled, lodged or housed
- 7 therein. No such systems shall be installed unless they are of a
- 8 type approved by the Department of Labor and Industry.
- 9 Any school building included in Class I shall be given the
- 10 option by the Department of Labor and Industry to install an
- 11 <u>electronic smoke detector system in lieu of an automatic water</u>
- 12 <u>sprinkler system whenever the Department of Labor and Industry</u>
- 13 <u>deems an automatic water sprinkler system necessary.</u>
- 14 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
