## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto, " crediting a fee to a collecting State
- 6 college or university for the creation of an emergency
- 7 maintenance fund.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Section 2008, act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
- 11 No.14), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," amended July
- 12 25, 1963 (P.L.308, No.163) and first paragraph amended February
- 13 17, 1970 (P.L.24, No.13), is amended to read:
- 14 Section 2008. Board and Fees.--The cost of room, board and
- 15 fees shall be fixed by the Secretary of Education upon
- 16 recommendation of the Board of State College and University
- 17 Directors.
- 18 The tuition of all students at the State Colleges, who are
- 19 residents of Pennsylvania, shall be paid by the Commonwealth.
- 20 Sufficient appropriations shall be made for this purpose. In

- 1 addition to such appropriation, the board of trustees with the
- 2 approval of the [Superintendent of Public Instruction] Secretary
- 3 of Education may fix a basic fee applicable to all undergraduate
- 4 students and may charge such other fees as may be necessary for
- 5 the proper operation of the college and may refund from their
- 6 respective advancement funds any advance registration deposits
- 7 paid by prospective students who are unable to enter college.
- 8 A differential in the basic fee may be established for those
- 9 students who sign an agreement to teach in the public schools of
- 10 this Commonwealth for not less than two years and who are
- 11 pursuing therein regular courses for the preparation of
- 12 teachers.
- 13 In addition to the other fees from time to time fixed,
- 14 charged and collected in the manner provided by law, a fee of
- 15 ten dollars (\$10) per semester of eighteen weeks and a
- 16 proportionate fee for each trimester, quarter, term and summer
- 17 sessions of six weeks or three weeks shall be fixed, charged and
- 18 collected from each student while in attendance at a college
- 19 [which has constructed a student community building, or at a
- 20 college for which the General State Authority has taken title to
- 21 a student community building] or university, which fee shall be
- 22 credited to the [Department of Property and Supplies and shall
- 23 be fixed by boards of trustees in amounts sufficient to meet
- 24 rentals due the General State Authority, pursuant to contracts
- 25 to lease student community buildings constructed by the said
- 26 Authority for the use of the State Colleges] collecting
- 27 institutions for the creation of a reserve fund for the purpose
- 28 of providing necessary emergency maintenance of campus buildings
- 29 and grounds as approved by the Secretary of Education.
- In addition to rental fees from time to time fixed, charged

- 1 and collected in the manner provided by law from each person
- 2 residing in State-owned or State-leased residential facilities
- 3 at a State College or university for the maintenance and
- 4 operation of such facilities, a sum of not more than three
- 5 dollars per week shall be fixed, charged and collected from each
- 6 such person as an additional rental fee. Such additional rental
- 7 fees shall be paid to the Commonwealth and as much of said fees
- 8 as may be necessary shall be credited to the Department of
- 9 [Public Instruction] Education for the creation of--
- 10 (a) A Reserve Fund for Contingencies and Capital
- 11 Replacements, provided by annual payments from each [teachers']
- 12 <u>State</u> college <u>or university</u> at the rate of one cent (\$.01) per
- 13 cubic foot for each dormitory constructed, and
- 14 (b) A Furniture and Equipment Reserve Fund, provided by
- 15 annual payments from each State College or university at the
- 16 rate of eight per cent of the original cost of furniture and
- 17 equipment for each building, with the further provision that
- 18 such payments to these reserve funds shall be deposited annually
- 19 to the credit of the contributing college in order that accrued
- 20 annual payments and earned interest may be available for the
- 21 exclusive use of the contributing college for the specific
- 22 purposes designated or for such purposes as may be approved by
- 23 the [Superintendent of Public Instruction] Secretary of
- 24 Education.
- 25 All moneys accumulated in the above reserve funds shall be
- 26 paid by the Department of [Public Instruction] Education from
- 27 the funds for the purposes for which the funds were created in
- 28 accordance with disbursement procedures as provided by law. All
- 29 additional rental fee moneys collected in excess of the amounts
- 30 required to be deposited in the reserve funds shall be credited

- 1 to the Department of [Property and Supplies] General Services
- 2 and paid on account of rentals due the General State Authority
- 3 pursuant to contracts to lease dormitories constructed by the
- 4 said Authority for the use of the State Colleges.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1979.
