1	THIS SECTION SHALL BE SENTENCED to make restitution of any money	
2	gained through the false claim and to a suspension or revocation	
3	of any license issued under this act for such time as the court	
4	deems appropriate. The Attorney General shall prosecute any	<
5	person charged with making false claims for payment from public
