16	(a) OffenseAny physician who willfully fails or refuses
17	to inform a female patient of the availability of medical
18	techniques which reduce the risk of birth defects, including,

but not limited to, amniocentesis, shall be guilty of a
misdemeanor of the third degree.

3 (b) License revocation.--A physician shall be subject to 4 revocation of license upon a second conviction under this 5 section.

6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
