In the House of Representatives, July 2, 1980

- 1 WHEREAS, 5 U.S.C. § 221 provides that any person over 18
- 2 years of age who refuses or willfully neglects to answer to the
- 3 best of such person's knowledge any questions relating to such
- 4 person or such person's family on any schedule submitted to him
- 5 or her in connection with any census shall be fined not more
- 6 than \$100; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The imposition of a fine for refusing or willfully
- 8 neglecting to answer such questions is unjust; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 10 memorialize the Congress of the United States to enact
- 11 legislation eliminating the penalty for refusing or willfully
- 12 neglecting to answer questions on any schedule submitted in
- 13 connection with a census; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be sent to presiding
- 15 officers of the United States Senate and the United States House
- 16 of Representatives and to each Senator and Representative from
- 17 Pennsylvania in the Congress of the United States.
