AN ACT

Limiting the causes for which the employment of a professional employee of certain colleges and universities may be terminated.
The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Except as otherwise provided in collective
bargaining agreements, the age of a professional employee of a
college or university shall be deemed sufficient reason for
termination of a contract heretofore or hereinafter entered into
between such professional employee and a college or university
located within this Commonwealth only upon the professional
employee's attainment of age 70 years. As used herein the term
"professional employee" means any employee whose work is:
(1) predominantly intellectual and varied in character;
(2) requires consistent exercise of discretion and
<pre>judgment;</pre>
(3) requires knowledge of an advanced nature in the

field of science or learning customarily acquired by

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- 1 specialized study in an institution of higher learning or its
- 2 equivalent; and
- 3 (4) is of such character that the output or result
- 4 accomplished cannot be standardized in relation to a given
- 5 period of time.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
