AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, requiring the insurance identification card to be in the possession of the operator.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Chapter 17 of Title 75, act of November 25, 1970
7	(P.L.707, No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes, is amended by adding a subchapter to read:

12	SUBCHAPTER C
13	PROOF OF INSURANCE
14	§ 1751. Driving motor vehicle without possession of insurance
15	identification card prohibited.
16	It is a summary offense for any person to drive or for an
17	owner knowingly to permit to be driven upon any highway any

vehicle of a type required to be insured under sections 104 and
110, act of July 19, 1974 (P.L.489, No.176), known as the
"Pennsylvania No-fault Motor Vehicle Insurance Act," without an
insurance identification card.

5 § 1752. Insurance identification card to be exhibited on6 demand.

7 (a) Carrying and exhibiting card.--Every insurance 8 identification card shall, at all times while the vehicle is 9 being operated upon a highway, be in the possession of the 10 person driving or in control of the vehicle or carried in the 11 vehicle and shall be exhibited upon demand of any police 12 officer.

13 (b) Production to avoid penalty. -- No person shall be convicted of violating this section or section 1751 (relating to 14 15 driving motor vehicle without possession of insurance 16 identification card prohibited) if the person produces at the 17 office of the issuing authority or at the office of the 18 arresting police officer within five days of the violation, an insurance identification card valid in the Commonwealth at the 19 20 time of the arrest.

21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
