## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), entitled 2 "An act relating to the manufacture, sale and possession of 3 controlled substances, other drugs, devices and cosmetics; conferring powers on the courts and the secretary and 4 Department of Health, and a newly created Pennsylvania Drug, 5 Device and Cosmetic Board; establishing schedules of 7 controlled substances; providing penalties; requiring registration of persons engaged in the drug trade and for the 8 9 revocation or suspension of certain licenses and 10 registrations; and repealing an act, "providing for the 11 disposition of forfeited money or currency. 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 28, act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, Section 1. 15 No.64), known as "The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act," is amended by adding a subsection to read: 16 17 Section 28. Forfeiture.--\* \* \* 18 (f) Whenever property forfeited under this act consists of money or currency it shall be transferred to the custody of the 19 department. The secretary shall transfer it to the Pennsylvania 20 State Police to be used by it for buys of controlled substances 21

- 1 by undercover agents and for conducting investigations of the
- 2 <u>illegal use of controlled substances and illegal gambling.</u>
- Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 3
