## AN ACT

Amending the act of October 10, 1974 (P.L.705, No.235), entitled 2 "An act providing for the training and licensing of watch 3 guards, protective patrolmen, detectives and criminal investigators, carrying and using lethal weapons in their 5 employment; imposing powers and duties on the Commissioner of 6 the Pennsylvania State Police; and providing penalties," 7 including officers of municipal authorities within the 8 definition of "privately employed agents." The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. The definition of "privately employed agents" in 12 section 3, act of October 10, 1974 (P.L.705, No.235), known as 13 the "Lethal Weapons Training Act," amended November 23, 1976 (P.L.1155, No.254), is amended to read: 14 Section 3. Definitions. -- As used in this act: 15 16 17 "Privately employed agents" include any person employed for 18 the purpose of providing watch guard, protective patrol, detective or criminal investigative services either for another 19 for a fee or for his employer. Privately employed agents do not 20

- 4 police officer of a municipal authority.
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- Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 6
