AN ACT

Requiring the superintendent of every public school AND THE 2 CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR OF CERTAIN PRIVATE SCHOOLS to make 3 available, upon request, lists of graduating seniors to 4 military recruiters and providing a penalty for the misuse of 5 any such lists. 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. It is the intent of the General Assembly through this legislation to fulfill its moral obligations and assist 10 military recruiters to achieve additional access to potential 11 recruits by compiling a list of prospective graduating seniors 12 for distribution, on request, to military recruiters. 13 Section 2. (a) Subject to the limitations of subsection 14 SUBSECTIONS (b) AND (C), the superintendent of every public school district and the chief administrator of every private 15 secondary school shall compile a list of senior students, both 16

male and female, including home address and published telephone

- 1 number who at the end of the respective academic year will
- 2 graduate from the school system. The list shall be compiled
- 3 within 45 calendar days of the effective date of this act and in
- 4 succeeding years by the first day of the academic year in which
- 5 the senior students will graduate.
- 6 (b) Prior to the end of any student's junior year, the
- 7 student may request the superintendent or chief administrator,
- 8 in writing, to exclude such student's name from the list
- 9 required pursuant to subsection (a). Each school district and
- 10 private secondary school shall notify the students, in writing,
- 11 at the end of their junior year of the requirements imposed by
- 12 subsection (a). Each student shall be given at least 21 calendar
- 13 days to request exclusion of such students names prior to the
- 14 release of such list.
- 15 (C) CHIEF ADMINISTRATORS OF PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOLS
- 16 SUPPORTED AND SPONSORED PRIMARILY BY RELIGIOUS SECTS, A MAJORITY
- 17 OF WHOSE MEMBERS CLAIM EXEMPTION FROM SERVICE IN THE ARMED
- 18 FORCES ON THE BASIS OF FIRMLY HELD AND LONG-STANDING RELIGIOUS
- 19 BELIEFS SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO COMPILE THE LISTS REQUIRED BY
- 20 SUBSECTION (A).
- 21 Section 3. (a) All lists prepared pursuant to this act may
- 22 be made available, with or without fee, to such persons as are
- 23 deemed appropriate by vote of the board of school directors or
- 24 the governing authority of any private secondary school when
- 25 requested in writing.
- 26 (b) Such lists must be made available to military recruiters
- 27 for the active component, the reserve component or the National
- 28 Guard component of the armed forces when requested in writing.
- 29 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
