AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1225, No.316), entitled 1 2 "An act concerning game and other wild birds and wild animals; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing 3 4 the law relating thereto, " further providing for the 5 operation of vehicles with flashing or rotating red lights and for unlawful acts. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Sections 729.1 and 730, act of June 3, 1937 Section 1. 10 (P.L.1225, No.316), known as "The Game Law," amended or added 11 June 11, 1976 (P.L.157, No.77), are amended to read: 12 Section 729.1. Flashing or Rotating Red Light .--13 Notwithstanding any provision of any other law to the contrary, 14 active full-time salaried Pennsylvania Game Protectors shall be 15 authorized to operate or move any [official] vehicle [owned by the Commonwealth which is identified or marked as such by 16 appropriate lettering, decal, or both, as approved by the 17

18 commission,] upon any street or highway within the Commonwealth,

with a flashing or rotating red light attached to such vehicle 1 2 in a temporary or permanent fashion which is visible in any 3 direction. <u>Pennsylvania Deputy Game Protectors shall be</u> 4 authorized to operate or move any vehicle upon any street or 5 highway within the Commonwealth, with a flashing or rotating red light temporarily attached to the vehicle when performing duties 6 within the scope of their authority. The commission shall 7 8 prescribe the type of flashing or rotating red light to be used 9 and the manner of attachment to the vehicle.

10 Section 730. Vehicles Required to Stop Upon Signal .-- It 11 shall be unlawful for the operator of any motor vehicle to fail or refuse to stop any such vehicle or conveyance of any kind, 12 13 being operated anywhere within this Commonwealth, upon request 14 or signal of any active full-time salaried Game Protector or 15 Deputy Game Protector using a flashing or rotating red light as 16 defined in section 729.1 of this act, or upon request or hand 17 signal of any officer whose duty it is to enforce the game laws, 18 when such officer in every instance is in uniform and shall display his badge or other insignia of identification, for the 19 20 purpose of inspecting or searching said vehicle or conveyance, 21 its passengers or contents, for the unlawful possession, 22 concealment, or transportation of any wild bird or wild animal 23 or parts thereof, or for the purpose of inspecting or searching 24 said vehicle or conveyance, its passengers or contents, for any 25 other violation of the act, or to in any manner interfere with 26 any such officer while making such inspection.

It is unlawful for any person to turn off any or all lights on a vehicle or conveyance, being operated anywhere within this Commonwealth, for the purpose of avoiding identification or arrest, upon request or signal to stop as required in this -2 - 2 - 2
