HOUSE RESOLUTION No. 122 Session of 1981

INTRODUCED BY HASAY, PETRARCA, NOYE, PHILLIPS AND COSLETT, OCTOBER 27, 1981

AS AMENDED, HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, NOVEMBER 17, 1981

In the House of Representatives, October 27, 1981 1 WHEREAS, Section 381.31 of the United States Postal Service 2 Domestic Mail Manual requires first-class postage to be paid on 3 each individual letter when two or more persons or organizations 4 mail in one envelope, the bills, statements of account, or other 5 letters of individuals or organizations, to a mutual addressee; 6 and 7 WHEREAS, There is no mechanism, short of opening and counting 8 the letters in the envelope, to enforce this regulation; and 9 WHEREAS, The lack of an adequate method of enforcement of 10 section 381.31 has resulted in an arbitrary and haphazard

11 application of the law; and

12 WHEREAS, The weight of the letter is the primary means by 13 which postage of a first-class letter is determined; and 14 WHEREAS, It is the intent of the President of the United 15 States to provide regulatory reform the RELIEF FROM unnecessary, < 16 cumbersome and unreasonable regulations; and 17 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania House of Representatives finds section 381.31 of the Domestic Mail Manual of the United States
Postal Service unnecessary, cumbersome and unreasonable;

3 therefore be it

4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 5 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorializes the President of the 6 United States, the Congress of the United States, the Postmaster 7 General of the United States Postal Service and the Board of 8 Governors of the United States Postal Service to repeal section 9 381.31 of the Domestic Mail Manual of the United States Postal 10 Service; and be it further

11 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be forwarded to the 12 President of the United States, the Speaker of the United States 13 House of Representatives, the President of the United States 14 Senate, to each member of the Pennsylvania Congressional 15 Delegation, the Postmaster General of the United States Postal 16 Service and the Board of Governors of the United States Postal 17 Service.
